## OPEN SESSION

### Agenda Item 1 – Call the meeting to Order / Roll Call / Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. and a quorum was present.

### Agenda Item 2 – Welcome - Chairman's Opening Remarks

Chairman John Carvelli opened the meeting, explaining that Commissioner John Frierson is not in attendance because of his health and wished him a speedy recovery.

He also announced that the North American Boxing Federation held their annual conference in San Francisco in July where Executive Officer (EO) Andy Foster was presented with a "Commissioner of the Year" award. Additionally, the California State Athletic Commission was presented with the "Commission of the Year" award.

Last, the World Boxing Council gave the Commission a plaque for the Staples Center event held on Saturday, August 29, 2015.

**Agenda Item 3 – Approval of the June 23, 2015, Commission Meeting Minutes**

*Commissioner Shen-Urquidez motioned to approve the June 23, 2015, Commission Meeting minutes as revised; Commissioner Ayala seconded the motion.*

*Motion passed 6-0 by roll call vote.*

**Agenda Item 4 – Appointment of a Neurological and Medical Subcommittee with defined goals and objectives**

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez suggested that on Agenda for the Advisory Committee on Medical and Safety Standards meeting on October 4, 2015, an item be added to discuss and generate an action plan for recruiting new Ringside Physicians for certain regions. She further suggested that they consider including ideas involving a transition team option.

Additionally, Commissioner Shen-Urquidez requested that the policy outline for the Neurological Subcommittee, add a step for DCA Legal review before a policy comes to the full Commission.

Vice Chair Lehman reiterated that Commissioner Williams work with EO Foster on prioritizing ideas and policy recommendations.

**Agenda Item 5 – Reappointments of the Advisory Committee on Medical and Safety Standards and approval of a one year action plan**

*Commissioner Williams motioned to establish the Subcommittee with Dr. Paul Wallace as Chair and delay the rest of the appointments until the full list of interested physicians are presented/recommended; Commissioner Lehman seconded the motion.*

Public Comment: Michael Martino, USA Boxing, mentioned that there is a roster of 23 doctors with USA boxing that may be interested in serving on the Committee.

*Motion passed 6-0 by roll call vote.*

**Agenda Item 8 – Posthumous Certificate of Appreciation for Michael King, founder and CEO of King Sports Worldwide**

A representative accepted the Commission's award on behalf of Mr. King's promotion and family.

**Agenda Item 7 – Certificate of Appreciation for Patrick Michael Connolly, licensed Judge and Referee with the California State Athletic Commission**

EO Foster explained that Mr. Connolly, who has been a Judge and Referee for the Commission for many years, is retiring. Mr. Connolly was not present to accept the award.

**Agenda Item 14 – Appeal for Seconds License from Javier Capetillo-Hernandez**

The hearing started at approximately 10:47 a.m.

Certified interpreter, Alfredo Sweeny introduced himself and Mr. Capetillo-Hernandez. Legal Counsel, Gary Duke reviewed the rules and guidelines of the following hearing. Deputy Attorney General, briefed the Commission with background and the details of Mr. Capetillo's appeal.

*Commissioner Shen-Urquidez motioned to deny Mr. Capetillo's appeal; Commissioner Williams seconded the motion.*

*Motion passed 5-1 by roll call vote.*

*Ayala – Yes; Dr. Williams – Yes; Sauter – Yes; Shen-Urquidez – No; Carvelli – Yes; Lehman – No*

**Agenda Item 10 – Discussion, review and possible action regarding the status of current delegation to USA Boxing**

EO Foster presented the Commission with the draft delegation letter for USA Boxing's continued delegation. Michael Martino, USA Boxing, gave the Commission an overview of the USA Boxing's background as well as future plans.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez presented her revisions to the delegation letter.

Chairman Carvelli directed the EO and Legal Counsel to work closely with Mr. Martino on compiling the appropriate documents for delegation and report back at the next Commission meeting.

**Agenda Item 11 – Review and approval of the United States Anti-Doping Agency being an approved specimen collector for the Commission**

EO Foster presented the Commission with background on USADA and how he recommends the Commission to utilize them.

*Vice Chair Lehman motioned to approve USADA as a recognized specimen collector at events under the direction of the EO; Commissioner Williams seconded the motion.*

*Motion passed 6-0 by roll call vote.*

**Agenda Item 9 – Discussion and possible action regarding amendments to California Code of Regulations section 826, Discrimination.**

*Vice Chair Lehman motioned to approve the amendments to the California Code of Regulations section 826; Commissioner Sauter seconded the motion.*

*Motion passed 6-0 by roll call vote.*

**Agenda Item 15 – Review and approval of the CSAC Catastrophic Incident Plan**

Vice Chair Lehman presented her revisions to the CSAC Catastrophic Incident Plan.

*Vice Chair Lehman motioned to approve the CSAC Catastrophic Incident Plan as revised and to distribute the document to all events; Commissioner Ayala seconded the motion.*

*Motion passed 6-0 by roll call vote.*

**Agenda Item 12 – Continue Discussion and possible action concerning International Kickboxing Federation's delegation**

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez reviewed the prior meetings that she has had with Mr. Fossum regarding many discrepancies with the IKF website and database.

*Commissioner Shen-Urquidez suggested that IKF's delegation be extended another 60-days to next meeting and review the delegation at the next meeting.*

*Commissioner Shen-Urquidez motioned to approve IKF delegation for three (3) months; no second. Motion dies for lack of second.*

*Chairman Carvelli motioned to approve IKF delegation for one (1) year; Commissioner Williams seconded the motion.*

*Motion passed 4-2 by roll call vote.*

*Carvelli – Yes; Lehman – Yes; Shen-Urquidez – No; Sauter – No; Ayala – Yes; Dr. Williams – Yes*

**Agenda Item 13 – Discussion and possible action regarding non-sanctioned mixed martial arts events**

EO Foster presented the Commission with background on information regarding unsanctioned events that are being held where the level of the matchmaking and enforcement is concerning. He recommended that the Commission consider a regulation to discipline licensees who participate in these unsanctioned events.

Chairman Carvelli to work with EO Foster regarding options on outreach to the unsanctioned fight venues/casinos, matchmaking practices, medical requirements, and report back to the Commission at the next meeting.

**Agenda Item 6 – Executive Officer's Report**

a. Budget Update

EO Foster presented the Commission with FM13 of FY2014-15 as well as FM1 of FY2015-16. The Commission deposited at total of \$1,726,515 and spent \$1,420,000. The fund reserve is at about 7-8 months reserve.

b. Report on Pending and Proposed Regulations and Legislation

EO Foster reported that Senate Bill 469 finished and was sent for concurrence. The Transgender and Therapeutic Use Exemption Regulations were sent over to the Office of Administrative Law on July 28, 2015. It scheduled for public hearing on September 21, 2015 at the CSAC office in Sacramento.

The Television Broadcast Fee regulation package was approved and became effective on July 1, 2015.

The Lost Beneficiary Clause for Pension is effective October 1, 2015.

The Neurological Account regulation ran out of time, however is one of the goals of the Advisory Committee on Medical and Safety Standards to work on getting language for this regulation.

c. Traumatic Brain Injury Test Field Kits Update

EO Foster reported that the field has been training with and utilizing the InfraScanners. He mentioned that the doctors are practicing with them, but that he would like to have the company come out and conduct more training with the doctors. He suggested that with training they are likely to utilize them more often.

d. Status Update of Officials Training Subcommittee

EO reported that he has been working with Commissioner Shen-Uquidez and Ayala on the competency test. He mentioned that multiple versions of the test will be administered at the trainings for this year.

POD Index - 5 officials scored the Bellator event, and 5 officials scored the ESPN boxing show.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez presented to the Commission, the options that she has been working on for timekeeper's bell/horn. She mentioned that the company is willing to work with us to create a specific horn sound to be very recognizable.

- e. Status Update of Delegated Entities  
**CAMO:** EO Foster mentioned that he has been in communication with JT Steele regarding the weight-cutting issues and their implementation of extra examinations on the amateur level.  
**USFL:** EO Foster commended Mr. John Frank on the handling of his recent events.
- f. Neurological Fund Update  
EO Foster reported that the Neurological Fund balance is somewhere around \$615,000. He mentioned that he will be involved with discussions the new Neurological Subcommittee, moving forward.
- g. Recommendation to consider minimum purses for licensed athletes  
EO Foster recommended that the Commission consider a requirement for a minimum amount of money per round to prevent \$1 purses.  
Chairman Carvelli requested EO Foster to bring a proposal for regulation to the next Commission meeting so they can take action.
- h. Association of Boxing Commissions' San Diego Convention Update  
Chairman Carvelli, Commissioner Shen-Urquidez and EO Foster attended the Convention and gave instructions on California's drug testing protocol.
- i. Update on Process to Monitor and Report Weight Gain from Weigh-In to Bout  
EO Foster conducted a weight study utilizing the new Body Composition Scales. He explained that the results are constantly showing excessive weight gain from day of weigh-in and the day of the fight.
- j. Update regarding Instant Replay  
EO Foster presented the Commission with Association of Boxing Commission's Policy and Guidelines for Instant Replay.
- k. Update regarding Pechanga Indian Reservation  
EO Foster presented the Commission with information regarding Pechanga's consent to allow the Commission to regulate events in their jurisdiction.

Below and attached please find a CAMO update and report in anticipation of the regularly scheduled CSAC meeting scheduled for November 17, 2015 in Sacramento, CA:

**1. CAMO MINIMUM WEIGHT STANDARDS: UPDATE**

In Collaboration with the CSAC, CAMO is exploring new rules and regulations to address extreme weight-cutting practices by athletes that are potentially unhealthful. In an effort to manage the practice of extreme weight-cutting to unhealthful levels CAMO and CSAC executive officer Andy Foster propose a mandatory minimum competition weight ("Minimum Weight") that will be established for each athlete. The Minimum Weight will be established by a calculation set forth in a proposed CAMO Rule and Regulation change (see Exhibit #2).

In order to properly calculate the Minimum Weight, all athletes will be required to complete a body composition test to determine their lean body mass. CAMO proposes that the annual CAMO physical examination be amended to include a body composition test (see Exhibit #1).

Body composition tests are generally conducted by skin caliper or bioelectric impedance testing methods. CAMO is in the process of contacting physician offices to verify that body composition exams are generally available in physician offices and reasonably accessible to athletes. Preliminary feedback indicates that many physician offices do not have the needed equipment on hand to conduct these examinations. CAMO is exploring other potential options to make body composition testing accessible including, but not limited to: testing at CAMO events and establishing a network of ringside physicians to administer the physical exams in their offices. Several physicians have inquired if CAMO/CSAC can assist in obtaining the required medical devices or engage in a collective bargaining agreement to reduce the cost of the equipment.

**2. REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING AGE BRACKETS FOR COMPETITION:**

With the support of CSAC, CAMO established age brackets in order to promote fair matches and healthy completion in amateur MMA. New rules and regulations were implemented in October 2015 and the response from the stakeholders was positive. CAMO retains authority to approve matches outside of the standard age brackets when justified and fair given the totality of the circumstances.

### **3. CAMO SAFETY AND SUSPENSION REPORT:**

Attached as Exhibit #3 is the suspension history for all bouts that have been conducted since the September 1, 2015 CSAC meeting. In short, there have been no injuries of a heightened concern for the commission to review.

### **4. FINANCIAL REPORT:**

CAMO is currently preparing tax returns for fiscal year 2014 and will provide those returns to CSAC as soon as they are prepared. CAMO experienced a busy fall schedule that has increased reserves, which will be sufficient to maintain operations during the anticipated seasonal downturn in December and January.

### **5. STATE CHAMPIONSHIP FINALS:**

Each year, CAMO coordinates the official California State Championship Tournament that crowns a true California State Champion in each weigh class. The tournament takes place over four months and is seeded by algorithmic computations making it the only independent tournament in the country. Further, California remains the only state in the country with a structured state tournament, which we have proudly conducted for six consecutive years. The State Championship will take place on Saturday, December 19, 2015 in Santa Ana, CA at the famous Yost Theater. CAMO welcomes the Commission to join us for this great event and to see the true futures stars of the sport compete.

### **6. INSPECTOR TRAINING:**

In conjunction with the California State Championship, CAMO will host a CAMO Inspector training event on Saturday, December 19, prior to the State Finals. The instruction will include basic material such as hand-wrapping for new Officials as well as more advanced materials that include drug-testing procedures. The State Championship creates a wonderful opportunity for officials and inspectors from around the state to gather together in a spirit of camaraderie to share experiences, learn from one another, and advance the sport through collaboration.

In closing, the fall season of 2015 was successful and very busy for CAMO and CSAC. We are especially excited to continue working with the Minimum Competition Weight initiative and collaborating with CSAC to explore solutions to maximize fighter safety. Thank you for your continued support.

§ TBD. Minimum Competition Weight.

Any person applying for a license or the renewal of a license as an amateur mixed martial arts fighter will be issued a minimum competition weight ("Minimum Competition Weight"). A contestant shall not compete in any contest that is scheduled for a weight or weight class that is below his Minimum Competition Weight.

The calculation of the Minimum Competition Weight shall be established through a body composition test to determine lean body mass. The body composition test shall be conducted by skin calipers, bioelectric impedance, or any other test determined to be reliable by CAMO. The Minimum Competition Weight will be established by the sum of the lean body mass plus seven (7) percent of the lean body mass. [Lean Body Mass + (Lean Body Mass x 7%)].

A body composition test shall be completed by a licensed physician as part of the annual physical examination required for licensing. A contestant may establish a new Minimum Competition Weight at any time by submitting a new body composition test signed by a physician on the appropriate CAMO form.

### BACKGROUND

California Code of Regulations section 232 requires all contestants to be paid in full according to their contracts; however, this regulation does not specify a minimum purse amount. Several promoters continue to pay athletes with tickets or place "\$1" as the purse amount on the contract. Paying athletes only "\$1" or with tickets is an exploitative practice to the athletes. The Commission has the authority to change this regulation and ensure that the athletes competing leave the show with a minimum purse for their efforts. Furthermore, I do not anticipate any opposition to these proposed changes since \$100.00 per contracted round is already widely considered the "industry minimum". There is a possibility that smaller promoters paying athletes with tickets in lieu of actual compensation may not agree with the proposal, however, the benefit to the industry in California and the protection that the Commission would be providing for the athletes to have a minimum purse for their efforts are the issues to be considered.

### FISCAL IMPACT

The fiscal impact on business by promulgating this regulation would be very little in reality, as most promoters pay more than the industry minimum standard of \$100.00 per round.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer is supportive of this regulation change to protect athletes and ensure proper tax accounting. The EO recommends approving the proposed changes to section 232, of Article 3, of Division 2, of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations - "Payment of Contestants".

## PROPOSED LANGUAGE

*Amend Section 232 of Article 3 of Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:*

### **§ 232. Payment Of Contestants.**

(a) All contestants shall be paid in full according to their contracts, and no part or percentage of their remuneration may be withheld except by order of an official of the commission, nor shall any part thereof be returned through arrangement with the boxer or his manager to any matchmaker, assistant matchmaker, or club official. The boxer or manager may not assign his respective share of the purse, or any portion thereof, without the approval of the commission, upon written request filed with the commission at least 72 hours before the contest.

(b) At no time shall the contracted purse amount paid to the boxer be less than one hundred dollars (\$100) per round.

### BACKGROUND

The Commission submitted modifications to its regulations to the Office of Administrative Law on July 28, 2015, and held a public hearing on September 21, 2015. The Commission received public comments regarding the proposed changes from the National Center for Lesbian Rights (NCLR). The Transgender and TUE subcommittees worked with staff on preparing a response to the NCLR and also made changes to the proposed language as a result of NCLR's comments. These changes were posted for an additional 15-day comment period on October 5, 2015. Commission staff then received additional documentation to include in the Initial Statement of Reasons as "Material Relied Upon" which resulted in an additional 15-day comment period on October 20, 2015. The Commission did not receive any additional public comments during the two 15-day comment periods.

If approved by the Commission today, the proposed language and Final Statement of Reasons in your Commission packets are ready to submit to the Department of Consumer Affairs for approval.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer recommends approving the proposed changes to 201.5, 303, 424, 425, 426, 830, 831, 832, 833, 834, 835, 836 and 837 regarding "Definitions, Prohibited Substances and Methods, Therapeutic Use Exemptions, Transgender Athletes, and authorizing Commission staff to submit the final rulemaking package to DCA and OAL for approval.

# CALIFORNIA STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION

## Modified Text

Changes to the originally proposed language are shown by double underline for new text and underline with strikeout for deleted text.

### **1. Amend Section 201.5 of Article 1 of Chapter 1 of Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:**

#### § 201.5. Definitions, Gender-neutral pronouns.

As used in this chapter:

- (a) "commission" means the State Athletic Commission;
- (b) "code" means the Business and Professions Code;
- (c) "rules" means the Professional Boxing Rules.
- (d) the terms "club" and "promoter" are synonymous and used interchangeably, and include any person, partnership, club, corporation, organization or association conducting, holding or giving boxing contests.
- (e) ~~the masculine gender includes the feminine gender~~ all pronouns are gender-neutral unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Note: Authority cited: Section 18611, Business and Professions Code. Reference: Sections 18621 and 18622, Business and Professions Code.

### **2. Amend Section 303 of Article 6 of Chapter 1 Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:**

#### § 303. Administration or Use of ~~Drugs~~ Prohibited Substances, Prohibited Methods.

- (a) Intent of the Commission: It is each athlete's personal duty to ensure that no Prohibited Substance enters his or her body. Athletes are responsible for any Prohibited Substance or its metabolites or markers found to be present in their Samples. All athletes licensed by the commission may be required to submit to testing for prohibited substances at any time whether in-competition or out-of-competition and whether or not they have a competition scheduled.
- (b) Definitions. As used in this Regulation, the following terms have the following meanings:
  - (1) The "WADA Prohibited List" refers to the most current edition of "The World Anti-Doping Code, The Prohibited List International Standard"

(World Anti-Doping Agency) <https://www.wada-ama.org/en/resources/science-medicine/prohibited-list> which is hereby incorporated by reference.

(2) “Prohibited Substance” means those substances included in the WADA Prohibited List.

(3) “Prohibited Method” means those methods included in the WADA Prohibited List.

(c) Athletes with documented medical conditions requiring the use of a Prohibited Substance or a Prohibited Method in any event sanctioned by the commission or its authorized amateur sanctioning bodies shall request a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) from the commission pursuant to Regulation 424.

(d) A person who applies for or holds a license from the commission and who has at any time tested positive for a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method that has been confirmed by any state athletic commission shall be required as a condition of licensure or renewal to provide a urine specimen. In addition, **as directed by the commission representative**, a licensed athlete shall provide a urine specimen for drug testing either before or after the bout, **as directed by the commission representative**.

(e) A violation of this Regulation shall subject the athlete to administrative enforcement action pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 18841, et seq.

~~(a) The administration or use of any drugs, alcohol or stimulants, or injections in any part of the body, either before or during a match, to or by any boxer is prohibited.~~

~~(b) A person who applies for or holds a license as a professional boxer and who has at any time had a positive drug test confirmed by any commission for any substance described in subsection (c) shall be required as a condition of licensure or renewal to provide a urine specimen. In addition, a licensed boxer shall provide a urine specimen for drug testing either before or after the bout, as directed by the commission representative.~~

~~(c) A positive test (which has been confirmed by a laboratory utilized by the commission) for any of the following substances shall be conclusive evidence of a violation of subsection (a):~~

~~(1) Stimulants~~

~~(2) Narcotics~~

~~(3) Cannabinoids (marijuana)~~

- ~~(4) Anabolic agents (exogenous and endogenous)~~
- ~~(5) Peptide hormones~~
- ~~(6) Masking agents~~
- ~~(7) Diuretics~~
- ~~(8) Glucocorticosteroids~~
- ~~(9) Beta-2 agonists (asthma medications)~~
- ~~(10) Anti-estrogenic agents~~

**3. Adopt Sections 424, 425 and 426 of Article 12.5 of Chapter 1 of Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:**

**ARTICLE 12.5. THERAPEUTIC USE EXEMPTION**

**§424. Statement of Commission's Intent, Application of Article, Definitions.**

- (a) It is the Commission's intent to allow a narrow exception to Regulation 303's prohibition against the Administration or use of Prohibited Substances and/or Prohibited Methods for those athletes who are medically required to use a Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method. Such athletes may apply for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) only as provided by this Article. It is further the Commission's intent to ban all forms of Testosterone Replacement Therapy from use by athletes who are licensed by the Commission, except as expressly provided for in Commission Regulations, chapter 6.
- (b) This Article shall to all athletes who are licensed by the Commission or are participating in Commission-regulated events.
- (c) Definitions. As used in this Article, the following terms shall have the following meanings:
  - (1) "Prohibited Substance" is defined in Commission Regulation 303.
  - (2) "Prohibited Method" is defined in Commission Regulation 303.

- (3) “Testosterone Replacement Therapy” or “TRT” means the use of natural or synthetic testosterone to treat or replace testosterone deficiency in men.
- (4) “Board-certified physician” means a licensed doctor of medicine (M.D.) or osteopathy (O.D.), or a nurse practitioner or physician’s assistant, in good standing and authorized to practice under state law, and practicing consistent with the laws governing their respective scope of practice in the state in which they are licensed.
- (5) “Acute medical condition” includes but is not limited to gender dysphoria and low testosterone resulting from testicular cancer or treatments for testicular cancer.

NOTE: Authority cited: Section 18611, Business and Professions Code. Reference: Sections 18640, 18641, 18642, 18648, 18661, 18711 and 18714, Business and Professions Code.

§425. Application for a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE).

- (a) A TUE shall not be granted for any form of Testosterone Replacement Therapy except as required by law.
- (b) An athlete may apply to the commission for a TUE by submitting an Application for Determination of Therapeutic Use Exemption (form number PA014, revised 07/15). Such application must be complete and received by the Commission at least thirty (30) days in advance of the event in which the athlete will compete.
- (c) Each of the following shall accompany the Application for Determination of Therapeutic Use Exemption:
- (1) Medical information, which shall include:
    - (A) Diagnosis and etiology based upon the treating physician's evaluation.
    - (B) An evaluation by a Board-certified physician in the appropriate medical field.
    - (C) Patient medical history, which must be consistent with the standard of practice in the appropriate medical field relevant to the exemption requested.
    - (D) A physical exam, which must be consistent with the standard of practice in the appropriate medical field relevant to the exemption requested.

- (E) A testing/laboratory evaluation, which must be consistent with the standard of practice in the appropriate medical field relevant to the exemption requested.
  - (F) Pre-Fight - Lab data for the Prohibited Substance. If a value is found to be out of the normal range, the athlete's medical provider should take action to correct the level by repeating the lab and/or adjusting medication appropriately, which should be documented in the records submitted to the Commission.
  - (G) Day of Fight - Lab data for the therapeutic agent in question. Agent specific levels shall be drawn on the day of fight.
  - (H) Name of the Prohibited Substance or Prohibited Method.
  - (I) Dosage taken or to be taken.
  - (J) Method of administration.
  - (K) Duration of treatment.
- (2) A copy of the medical records in which the applicant's medical condition is well documented, and which must reflect that the condition existed prior to any test for a TUE application was performed.
- (3) Declaration under penalty of perjury of a board certified physician in the appropriate field of medicine, attesting that he/she has read and understood this Therapeutic Use Exemption Regulation, examined the athlete, and the athlete qualifies for an exemption.
- (d) A TUE application shall not be considered complete until the commission concludes there is sufficient medical information to determine the athlete is currently physically fit to compete safely.
- (1) A TUE application may be considered incomplete if the commission cannot reasonably verify the current licensure status of the athlete's treating physician or the medical information submitted with the TUE application. If an application is incomplete, the commission may require the athlete to provide medical information, including but not limited to, an examination pursuant to Rule 280, and lab reports from a certified laboratory as designated by the commission.
  - (2) All costs of providing information to provide a complete Application shall be the athlete's responsibility and information provided pursuant to this Rule shall not be considered a special medical evaluation within the meaning of Business and Professions Code section 18710.

(e) If the athlete intends to compete further in any event or competition that may subject the athlete to drug testing by the commission, the athlete must apply for a separate TUE for any prohibited substance in advance of such event or competition in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

(f) Retroactive Approvals in Emergency or Acute Medical Situations: The time period specified in this Article for submitting an application shall not apply to applications for retroactive approval. Retroactive TUE applications will only be considered in cases where emergency treatment or treatment of an acute medical condition was medically necessary.

(g) An application that is approved pursuant to this Article shall be valid for one approved competition.

§ 426. Denial of Application, Appeals.

(a) An incomplete TUE application may be deemed denied without further action by the commission.

(b) If the commission reasonably determines based upon the facts and circumstances of a particular application that the TUE application has been submitted for the purpose of enhancing the athlete's performance and/or giving the athlete an advantage over his/her competitor(s), the commission shall deny the application.

(c) A TUE shall not be granted when the commission reasonably concludes that denying the TUE application is in the best interests of protecting the public, or the health and safety of licensed athletes.

(d) If an application for TUE is denied, the athlete may submit an appeal in writing to the commission with seven (7) days of the commission's decision. The commission will set the matter for hearing within 30 days.

**4. *Adopt Sections 830 - 837, Article 1 of Chapter 6 of Division 2 of Title 4 of the California Code of Regulations to read as follows:***

Chapter 6. Transgender Athletes

## Article 1. General Provisions

### § 830. Definitions.

As used in this Chapter, the following terms have the following meanings:

- (a) “Gender Identity” is an individual’s internal, deeply-felt sense of being male or female. Everyone has a gender identity, which may or may not correspond to a person’s assigned **designated** sex at birth.
- (b) “Transgender” individuals are people with a gender identity that is different from their assigned **designated** sex at birth. A transgender male is a person who lives and identifies as a male, but who **whose designated sex** was assigned female gender at birth **was female**. A transgender female is a person who lives and identifies as female, but who **whose designated sex** was assigned male gender at birth **was male**.
- (c) “Gender Dysphoria” refers to the condition in the United States diagnostic manual (DSM-5 2013). Gender Dysphoria is characterized by intense and persistent discomfort with one’s sex characteristics—one’s assigned **designated sex at birth**. The suffering that arises has often been described as “being trapped in the wrong body.”
- (d) “Health Care Provider” includes any licensed doctor of medicine (M.D.) or osteopathy (D.O.) in good standing and authorized to practice medicine or surgery in their respective jurisdiction, as well as nurse practitioners or physician’s assistants in good standing and authorized to practice and practicing consistent with the laws governing their respective scope of their practice in the jurisdiction in which they are licensed.
- (e) “State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine” means a licensed doctor of medicine (M.D.) or osteopathy (D.O.) in good standing and authorized to practice under state law and practicing consistent with the laws governing their respective scope of practice in the state in which they are licensed.
- (f) “Hormone” means a member of a class of signaling molecules produced by glands in the body that are transported in the blood stream to certain targeted organs to regulate physiology and behavior. Among other things, hormones can regulate or augment mood, weight and strength.
- (g) “Application” refers to the Application for Professional Athlete (Form No. PA003, revised 07/15).

§ 831. Transgender Female Athletes (Male to Female)

(a) Transgender female (male to female) athletes who are not undergoing hormone therapy and without gonadectomy are eligible for licensure and participation in men's events.

(b) Transgender female athletes shall be eligible for licensure and participation in women's competitions if the commission approves the athlete's Application.

§ 832. Transgender Male Athletes (female to male).

(a) Transgender male (female to male) athletes who are not taking testosterone shall be eligible for licensure and participation in women's events.

(b) A transgender male athlete who is undergoing hormone treatment shall be eligible for licensure and participation in male competitions if the commission approved the athlete's Application.

§ 833. Applications and Appeals.

(a) At least 30 days before the event in which the athlete intends to compete, (1) a transgender female athlete who applies to compete in women's competitions, or (2) a transgender male athlete who applies to compete in men's competitions, shall submit their Application.

(1) No Application will be granted on an emergency basis.

(2) No Application will be granted on a retroactive basis.

(b) Transgender female athletes who apply to compete in women's competitions:

(1) A transgender female athlete who has had a gonadectomy shall also include as part of her Application:

- (A) Written confirmation by a State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine has confirmed that hormone therapy has been administered by a Health Care Provider for a minimum of 2 years after gonadectomy.
- (B) A letter from the State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine responsible for the care of the applicant that must include the following:
  - (i) Name of surgeon who performed the gonadectomy and the date and location of surgery;
  - (ii) Initial date hormone therapy began after gonadectomy (and prior to surgery, if relevant);
  - (iii) Hormone name/type, dose and interval of administration over the past two years;
  - (iv) Name, dose and duration of any anti-androgen treatment used over the past two years.

(2) A transgender female athlete who is undergoing hormone therapy but has not had a gonadectomy shall also include as part of her Application:

- (A) Written confirmation by a State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine that hormone therapy has been administered by a Health Care Provider for a minimum of two years.
- (B) A letter from the State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine responsible for the care of the applicant that must include the following:
  - (i) Initial date hormone therapy began;
  - (ii) Hormone name/type, dose and interval of administration over the past two years;
  - (iii) Lab reports of estradiol and testosterone levels with a goal of serum estradiol levels within the normal range for

healthy premenopausal women (lab specific) and suppression of testosterone levels to those normally found in women (lab specific) for the past two years;

(iv) Name, dose and duration of any anti-androgen treatment used over the past two years.

(c) Transgender male athletes who apply to compete in men's competitions:

(1) The athlete's Application shall also include:

(A) Confirmation from a State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine that hormone therapy has been administered by a Health Care Provider for a minimum of 2 years.

(B) A letter from the State-licensed physician or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine responsible for the care of the applicant that must include the following:

(i) Initial date of hormone therapy;

(ii) Hormone name/type, dose and interval of administration for the past six months;

(iii) Lab reports of estradiol and testosterone levels for the past six months with a goal of serum estradiol levels within the normal range for healthy men (lab specific) and testosterone levels within the range for healthy men (lab specific).

(d) If the commission denies an Application submitted pursuant to this Chapter, the athlete may appeal that decision; such appeal must be submitted in writing to the commission within seven (7) days of the Commission's decision. The commission will set the matter for hearing within thirty (30) days.

§ 834. Provisions Applicable to All Transgender Athletes.

(a) An application shall not be considered complete until the commission concludes there is sufficient medical information to determine the athlete is currently physically fit to compete safely.

(1) An athlete's Application may be considered incomplete if the commission cannot reasonably verify the current licensure status of the athlete's treating physician or the medical information submitted with the Application. If an Application is incomplete, the commission may require the athlete to provide medical information, including but not limited to, an examination pursuant to Rule 280 that is conducted by a doctor of medicine or osteopathy as assigned by the commission, and lab reports showing Hormone levels (or other related blood work) from a certified laboratory as designated by the commission.

(2) All costs of providing information to provide a complete Application shall be the athlete's responsibility and information provided pursuant to this Rule shall not be considered a special medical evaluation within the meaning of Business and Professions Code section 18710.

(b) Pre-Competition and Day of Competition Testing Requirements:

(1) Transgender female athletes who have not had a gonadectomy and are participating in a female competition:

(A) Two weeks before a scheduled competition, the athlete must submit lab reports of estradiol and testosterone levels for the past six months showing serum estradiol levels within the normal range for healthy premenopausal women (lab specific) and suppression of testosterone levels to those normally found in women (lab specific).

(B) The day prior to any scheduled competition, the athlete must submit on the Pre-Bout Medical Questionnaire Form (Form Number PB001) the time, date, amount and method of the last dose(s) of estradiol used within the past two weeks.

(C) One the day of any scheduled competition, the athlete's test results for testosterone shall not be above the normal range for healthy premenopausal women.

(2) Transgender male athletes who are participating in a male competition:

(A) Two weeks before a scheduled competition, the athlete must submit lab reports of estradiol and testosterone levels for the past six months showing serum estradiol levels within the normal range for healthy

men (lab specific) and testosterone levels within the range for healthy men (lab specific).

(B) The day prior to any scheduled competition, the athlete must submit on the Pre-Bout Medical Questionnaire Form (Form Number PB001) the time, date, amount and method of the last dose(s) of testosterone used within the past two weeks.

(C) On the day of the scheduled competition, the athlete's testosterone levels must not be above the normal range for healthy men (lab specific).

(3) Any level of testosterone above the normal range may result in the athlete's disqualification or other administrative enforcement action.

(4) Repeat elevated testosterone levels during the 6 months prior to the competition may be grounds for disqualification or other administrative enforcement action.

(c) Depending on the facts unique to each applicant, the commission may require or prohibit the use of certain clothing and/or safety equipment in competitions as a condition of licensure.

(d) The commission shall keep the athlete's medical information and application documentation confidential in accordance with applicable state and federal privacy laws.

#### § 835. Commission Education.

Commission representatives shall be educated regarding Gender Dysphoria and Transgender athletes to ensure their safe and equal participation in events regulated by the commission.

#### § 836. Not Subject to Delegation.

The provisions of this Chapter shall not be delegable by the commission pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 18646.

§ 837. Approved Application Exempt from Rule 303.

An athlete whose Application is submitted pursuant to section 831(b) or 832(b) and is approved under this Chapter shall be exempt from Rule 303, "Administration or Use of Prohibited Substances, Prohibited Methods," for only those substances and methods that are identified in the athlete's Application.
