Proposed Regulatory Language Title 16, California Code of Regulations Sections 87, 88, 88.1, 88.2, 89, and 90

11 § 87 Basic Requirements.

12 (a) 80 Hours.

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13 As a condition for renewing a license in an active status, a licensee shall complete at 14 least 80 hours of continuing education in the two-year period immediately preceding 15 license expiration, and meet the reporting requirements described in Section 89(a). 16 A licensee engaged in the practice of public accountancy as defined in Section 5051 of the Business and Professions Code is required to hold a license in an active 17 status. No carryover of continuing education is permitted from one license renewal 18 19 period to another. (1) A licensee renewing a license in an active status, shall complete a minimum of 20 20 hours in each year of the two-year license renewal period, with a minimum of 12 21 22 hours of the required 20 hours in technical subject areas as described in subsection 23 (a)(2).

- 24 (2) Licensees shall complete a minimum of 50 percent of the required continuing 25 education hours in the following technical subject areas: accounting, auditing, fraud, 26 taxation, consulting, financial planning, business law, economics, management 27
- services, statistics, ethics as defined in subsection (b), regulatory review as defined in Section 87.8, computer and information technology (except for word processing), 28
- 29 and specialized industry or government practices that focus primarily upon the
- maintenance and/or enhancement of the public accounting skills and knowledge 30
- 31 needed to competently practice public accounting.
- 32 (3) Licensees may claim no more than 50 percent of the required number of
- continuing education hours in the following non-technical nontechnical subject areas 33
- 34 that contribute to the professional competence of a licensee: communication skills,
- 35 word processing, sales, marketing, motivational techniques, negotiation skills, office
- 36 management, practice management, and personnel management.
- (A) Behavioral ethics (e.g., ethical decision-making; personal ethics; diversity, equity 37 38 and inclusion: etc.).
- 39 (B) Business management and organization (e.g., organization of a public

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1 accounting practice, etc.).

- <u>(C) Communications and Marketing (e.g., business presentations; business writing;</u>
 <u>social media; customer communications; marketing professional services; etc.).</u>
- 4 (D) Computer software and applications (e.g., courses in the general use of software
- 5 used in a business environment, etc.).
- 6 (E) Personal Development (e.g., career planning; leadership; time management;
 7 etc.).
- 8 Personnel/Human resources (e.g., attracting; motivating; developing and retaining
 9 employees; social justice in staff recruitment and retention; etc.).
- 10 (F) Production (e.g., operations management; inventory management; supply

11 operations, etc.).

- 12 (4) Programs in the following subject areas are not acceptable continuing
- 13 education: personal growth, self-realization, spirituality, personal health and/or
- 14 fitness, sports and recreation, foreign languages and cultures and other subjects
- 15 which will not contribute directly to the professional competence of the licensee.
- 16 (b) Ethics Continuing Education Requirement.
- 17 À licensee renewing a license in an active status shall complete four hours of the
- 18 80 hours of continuing education required pursuant to subsection (a) in an ethics
- 19 course. The course subject matter shall consist of one or more of the following
- areas: a review of nationally recognized codes of conduct emphasizing how the
- 21 codes relate to professional responsibilities; case-based instruction focusing on
- real-life situational learning; ethical dilemmas facing the accounting profession; or business ethics, ethical sensitivity, and consumer expectations. Programs in the
- business ethics, ethical sensitivity, and consumer expectations. Programs in
 following subject areas are not acceptable toward meeting this requirement:

 25 sexual harassment, workplace harassment, or workplace violence. Courses must
- 26 be a minimum of one hour as described in Section 88.2.
- 27 (c) Government Auditing Continuing Education Requirement.
- A licensee who engages in planning, directing, conducting substantial portions of field work, or reporting on financial or compliance audits of a governmental agency shall
- 30 complete 24 hours of the 80 hours required pursuant to subsection (a) in the areas of
- 31 governmental accounting, auditing or related subjects. This continuing education shall
- 32 be completed in the same two-year license renewal period as the report is issued. A
- 33 governmental agency is defined as any department, office, commission, authority,
- 34 board, government-owned corporation, or other independent establishment of any
- branch of federal, state or local government. Related subjects are those which
- 36 maintain or enhance the licensee's knowledge of governmental operations, laws,
- regulations or reports; any special requirements of governmental agencies; subjects
 related to the specific or unique environment in which the audited entity operates; and
- related to the specific or unique environment in which the audited entity ope other auditing subjects which may be appropriate to government auditing
- other auditing subjects which may be appropriate to government auditing
 engagements. A licensee who meets the requirements of this subsection shall be
- 41 deemed to have met the requirements of subsection (d).
- 42 (d) Accounting and Auditing Continuing Education Requirement.
- 43 A licensee who engages in planning, directing, performing substantial portions of the
- 44 work, or reporting on an audit, review, compilation, or attestation service, shall

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- 1 complete 24 hours of the 80 hours of continuing education required pursuant to
- 2 subsection (a) in the course subject matter pertaining to financial statement
- 3 preparation and/or reporting (whether such statements are prepared on the basis of
- 4 generally accepted accounting principles or other comprehensive bases of
- accounting), auditing, reviews, compilations, industry accounting, attestation services,
 or assurance services. This continuing education shall be completed in the same two-
- 7 year license renewal period as the report is issued.
- 8 (e) Accounting and Auditing Continuing Education Requirement When Providing
 9 Preparation Engagements as Highest Level of Service.
- A licensee who provided preparation engagements as <u>their his/her-highest level of</u>
 service shall complete eight hours of the 80 hours of continuing education required
 pursuant to subsection (a) in preparation engagements or accounting and auditing as
- 13 described in Section 87(d).
- 14 (f) Fraud Continuing Education Requirement.
- 15 A licensee who must complete continuing education pursuant to subsections (c), (d),
- 16 or (e) of this section shall also complete an additional four hours of continuing
- education specifically related to the prevention, detection, and/or reporting of fraud
- affecting financial statements. This continuing education shall be part of the 80 hours
- of continuing education required by subsection (a), but shall not be part of the
- 20 continuing education required by subsections (c), (d), or (e).
- 21 (g) Failure to Comply.
- A licensee's willful failure to comply with the requirements of this section shall
- constitute cause for disciplinary action pursuant to Section 5100(g) of the
- Accountancy Act.

30 § 88. Programs Which Qualify.

- 31 (a) (1) The overriding consideration in determining whether a specific program
- 32 qualifies as acceptable continuing education is that it be a formal program of learning
- 33 which contributes directly to the professional competence of a licensee in public
- 34 practice. It is the obligation of each licensee to select a course of study, consistent
- 35 with the requirements of this section and Sections 88.1 and 88.2, which will contribute 36 directly to their bis/ber professional competence
- 36 directly to <u>their his/her</u> professional competence.
- 37 (2) A formal program of learning is an instructional activity that meets the
- 38 requirements of this section and Sections 88.1 and 88.2 or a course for which
- 39 academic credit is granted by a university, college, or other institution of learning
- 40 accredited by a regional or national accrediting agency.
- 41 (b) <u>Live Presentations:</u> The following types of live presentation programs are
- 42 deemed to qualify as acceptable continuing education provided the standards
- 43 outlined in Section 88(a), Section 88.1, and Section 88.2 are maintained.
- 44 (1) Professional development programs of national and state accounting organizations.

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1	(2) Technical session at meetings of national and state accounting organizations
2	and their chapters which are designed as formal educational programs.
3	 (3) University or college courses: (i) Credit courses: -each semester hour credit shall equal 15 hours toward
4	(I) Credit courses, -each semester hour credit shall equal 10 hours
5	the requirement. Each quarter hour credit shall equal 10 hours.
6	(ii) Non-credit courses: -each classroom hour will equal one qualifying hour.
7	(4) Other formal educational programs provided the program meets the
8	required standards.
9	(c) Group Internet-Based Programs (Webcast): Programs that enable a licensee to

14	is permissible only where a live facilitator logs into the program to ask questions on
15	behalf of the group. The live facilitator shall document and verify group participation
16	and attendance in accordance with the requirements of Section 88.1 and 88.2.
17	(d) Individual Study: Formal correspondence or other individual study programs are
18	qualifying provided they meet all the following requirements:
19	(1) The the program is based upon materials specifically developed for instructional

21	(2) <u>The the program meets the requirements of Section 88(a)</u> , Section 88.1, and
22	Section 88.2, (a)
23	(3) The the program is completed within one year from the date of purchase or
24	enrollment <u>., and</u>

26	(e) Individual Study/National Examinations Continuing Education: Self-study modules
27	for national examinations that contribute to the professional competency of a licensee
28	in public practice, such as the CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNER ™ Certification
29	Examination or the Certified Management Accountant examination qualify as
30	acceptable continuing education if the modules meet the requirements of subsection
31	(d).
32	(f) Nano Learning Programs: Programs enabling a licensee to learn a given subject
33	containing a minimum of one learning objective in a minimum of 10-minutes and less
34	than 20 minutes including the test, through the use of electronic media and without
35	interaction with a live instructor. A nano learning program is not a live or group
36	internet-based program. Nano learning programs are qualifying provided they meet all
37	the following requirements:
38	(1) The program is based upon materials specifically developed for instructional
39	USE. (a) T
40	(2) The program meets the requirements of Section 88(a), Section 88.1(d), and
41	Section 88.2(d).
42	(3) Continuing education credits are not awarded in the following subjects: ethics
43	as defined in Section 87(b), prevention, detection and/or reporting of fraud
44	affecting financial statements as defined in Section 87(f), or a regulatory review
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1	course as defined in Section 87.8.	
2	(4) The program is completed within one year from the date of purchase or	
3	enrollment in the program.	
4	(5) The licensee receives a 100 percent score on a test given to the participants	
5	prior to issuance of the continuing education credit.	
6	(g) Blended Learning Program: Programs include both asynchronous and	
7	synchronous learning and provide clear instructions and information to participants	
8	that summarize the different components of the program and what must be	
9	completed or achieved during each component in order to qualify for continuing	
10	education hours. For the purposes of this subsection, "synchronous" means a	
11	program in which participants engage simultaneously in instructional methods and	
12	"asynchronous" means a program in which participants have control over the time,	
13	place and pace of learning. Blended learning programs are qualifying provided they	
14	meet all the following requirements:	
15	(1) The program is based upon material specifically developed for instructional use.	
16	(2) The program meets the requirements of Section 88(a), Section 88.1(e), and	
17	<u>Section 88.2(e).</u>	
18	(3) If the primary components of the blended learning program are synchronous	
19	learning activities, then continuing education hours for pre-program, post-program,	
20	and homework assignments cannot constitute more than 25 percent of the total	
21	continuing education hours awarded for the blended learning program.	
22	(4) If the primary components of the blended learning program are asynchronous,	
23	then the program must use a test to demonstrate achievement of the learning	
24	objectives of the program that measures no less than 75 percent of the learning	
25	objectives for the program. The test must be completed during or after the program	
26	with a cumulative passing score before issuing continuing education hours for the	
27	<u>course.</u>	
28	(fh) Instructor/Speaker Continuing Education: Credit as an instructor, discussion	
29	leader, or speaker shall be allowed for any meeting or program provided that the	
30	session is one which meets the continuing education requirements set forth in	
31	subsection (a)(1), Section 88.1, and Section 88.2.	
32	The credit allowed an instructor, discussion leader, or a speaker shall be on the basis	
33	of actual presentation hours, plus up to two additional hours for actual preparation	
34	time for each hour taught. The maximum credit for such preparation and teaching	
35	shall not exceed 50 percent of the renewal period requirement. For repeat	
36	presentations, an instructor shall receive no credit unless the instructor can	
37	demonstrate that the program content was substantially changed and that such	
38	change required significant additional study or research. Credit for licensees	
39	attending, not as instructors, discussion leader, or speakers, is limited to the actual	
40	meeting time.	
41	(gi) Writing-Related and Technical Continuing Education: Credit may be allowed by	
42	the Board on an hour-for-hour basis for the following activities:	
43	(1) Writing published articles and books provided the publisher is not under the	
44	control of the licensee, and the article and/or book would contribute to his/her their

- (2) Writing instructional materials for any continuing education program which meets
 the requirements of subsection (a)(1), Section 88.1, and Section 88.2,
- 4 (3) Writing questions for the Uniform Certified Public Accountant Examination,
- 5 (4) Performing a technical review of instructional materials for any continuing
- 6 education program which meets the requirements of subsection (a)(1), Section
- 7 88.1, and Section 88.2. For the purposes of this section a technical review shall
- 8 mean reviewing for technical accuracy, currency of the information, and
- 9 attainment of stated learning objectives.
- (hj) The maximum credit allowed under subsection (gi) shall not exceed 25 50
 percent of the renewal period requirement.

- 20 (a) Live Presentation.
- 21 In order to qualify as acceptable continuing education under Section 88(b) the
- 22 provider of a live presentation program must meet all the following requirements:
- 23 (1) Require attendance and retain for a period of five years a record of attendance
- that accurately assigns the appropriate number of contact hours for participants
- 25 including those who arrive late or leave early.
- 26 (2) Retain for a period of five years written educational goals and specific learning
- 27 objectives, as well as a syllabus, which provides a general outline, instructional
- objectives, and a summary of topics for the course. A copy of the educational goals,
- learning objectives, and course syllabus shall be made available to the California
 Board of Accountancy upon request.
- 31 (3) Issue a certificate of completion, with verification certified by a program provider
- 32 representative such as a signature or seal, to each licensee upon satisfactory
- 33 completion of the course and retain records of licensees receiving certificates of
- 34 completion for a period of five years. The amount of credit reflected on the certificate
- of completion shall be calculated in accordance with Section 88.2(a). The certificate
- of completion must delineate the subject areas, as described in Section 87(a)(2) and
- 37 (3), for which the licensee may claim credit.
- 38 (b) Group Internet-Based Programs (Webcast).
- 39 In order to qualify as acceptable continuing education under Section 88(c), the
- 40 provider of a group internet-based program Group Internet-Based Program
- 41 (Webcast) must meet all the following requirements:
- 42 (1) Require and monitor attendance throughout the program by using
- 43 attendance monitoring devices such as polling, questions, or surveys. The
- 44 program shall include a minimum of three monitoring events each hour, at least

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- 1 one of which occurs at an irregular interval.
- 2 (2) Have a live instructor while the program is being presented and a feature
- allowing participants to send questions/comments directly to the instructor and
 receive answers during the program.
- 5 (3) If it is recorded or archived, have a live subject matter expert facilitate the
- 6 program (webcast Webcast) to answer questions. A recorded or archived program
- 7 that does not have a live subject matter expert must meet the self-study or adaptive
- 8 <u>learning self-study</u> requirements of subsection (c), Section 88(d), and Section
 9 88.2(c).
- (4) Retain for a period of five years a record of attendance that accurately assigns
 the appropriate number of participation hours for participants.
- 12 (5) Retain for a period of five years written educational goals and specific learning
- 13 objectives, as well as a syllabus, which provides a general outline, instructional
- 14 objectives, and a summary of topics for the course. A copy of the educational goals,
- 15 learning objectives, and course syllabus shall be made available to the California
- 16 Board of Accountancy upon request.
- 17 (6) Issue a certificate of completion, with verification certified by a program provider
- 18 representative such as a signature or seal, to each licensee upon satisfactory
- 19 completion of the course. Satisfactory completion shall at a minimum require 20 responding to at least 75 percent of the monitoring events described in subse
- responding to at least 75 percent of the monitoring events described in subsection
 (b)(1) during the period for which continuing education credit is being granted. Retain
- records of licensees receiving certificates of completion for a period of five years. The
- amount of credit shall be displayed on the certificate of completion and shall be

- 39 presentation program must meet all of the following requirements:
- 40 (1) Be measured in 50-minute class hours. A program must be at least one 50-minute
- 41 class hour in length to be acceptable continuing education. For a program composed
- 42 of several segments in which individual segments are less than 50 minutes, the sum
