ORDER

This matter came before the California State Athletic Commission for Arbitration on April 27, 2012, as duly noticed and scheduled. Prior to commencement of the Arbitration, the parties, John Molina, (Boxer) his counsel of record, Nigel Burns, Dan Goossen, Goossen Tudor Promotions, Inc., (Promoter) and its counsel of record, Farzad Tabatabai reached a stipulated settlement to resolve their differences and withdraw their request for arbitration. The parties settlement was placed on the record by the Court Reporting firm of Kasmar Zanglis & Associates. The parties settlement is as follows:

The original promotional contract dated December 13, 2008, which is scheduled to expire on December 31, 2013; will now expire on June 15, 2014. Per the agreement of the parties, Promoter has satisfied all its bout obligations through year three of the promotional contract as of June 14, 2012.

Promoter promises to procure and Boxer agrees to accept three more fights to satisfy the terms of the promotional contract as follows:


First bout will occur on or about June 23, 2012, it will be an 8 round fight with a \$6,000 purse;

Second bout will be scheduled with the best efforts of all parties, it will be a 8 to 10 round fight with a boxer ranked between 5 and 20, with a \$10,000 purse;

Third bout, will be scheduled with the best efforts of all parties and may be a World Title fight, no payment guarantee.

This order shall be effective on the 30th day of April, 2012.
