

OPEN SESSION

<u>Agenda Item 1 – Call the meeting to Order / Roll Call / Pledge of Allegiance/</u> Establishment of Quorum

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m., Chair John Carvelli swore in newly appointed Commissioner James Araby. Executive Officer (EO) Andy Foster called roll and a quorum was established.

Agenda Item 2 – Welcome – Chairman's opening remarks

Chair John Carvelli welcomed new Commission employee Patrisha Blackstock. He also announced legal counsel Spencer Walker was appointed to the Department of Treasury and thanked him for all his hard work.

Chair Carvelli announced he and Commissioner Shen-Urquidez had a chance to attend the recent event at Microsoft Theater. He added the set-up was interesting as the ring was on a stage and you had a chance to see the event from a different perspective. The event was well attended and had great fights with great warriors. There was a total of 13 bouts with 100 plus rounds.

Chair Carvelli mentioned a recent article was published about the California Commission. California breaking records with the number of events being held in the state. In 2018, the Commission ran 118 professional boxing events with 59 of them being televised events. He stated the Commission is doing more events than other states combined, not including amateur events. This is very exciting, we have a lot of activity and there is a lot of respect for California. Chair Carvelli congratulated the Commission and complimented the staff and associates for all their hard work.

<u>Agenda Item 3 – Election of Officer for 2019 Pursuant to the Requirements of</u> Business and Professions Code section 18606

Commissioner Dr. Williams motioned to continue with the current officers with John Carvelli as Chair and Mary Lehman as Vice Chair.

Commissioner Ayala seconded the motion

No other nominations were received.

No Commissioner or public comments received.

Vice Chair Lehman and Chair Carvelli accepted their nominations.

The motion passed 7-0 by roll call vote

<u>Agenda Item 4 – Approval of the December 11, 2018, Commission Meeting Minutes</u>

EO Foster presented the December 11, 2018, Commission meeting minutes for approval. Vice Chair Lehman thanked EO Foster for the detailed minutes and stated it was very helpful to have a precise record of what was done at the last meeting.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez motioned to approve the minutes. Vice Chair Lehman seconded the motion.

No commissioner or public comment.

The motion **passed** 7-0 by roll call vote.

<u>Agenda Item 5- Update from Dean Grafilo, Director of the Department of Consumer</u> Affairs

Dean Grafilo, Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs (DCA) stated the Commission will always be his favorite program under the DCA umbrella as he is a former Commissioner. Director Grafilo highlighted some of the things DCA accomplished in 2018; 9 licensing, enforcement and workgroup meeting, 3 substance abuse seminars, 4 Director

quarterly meetings, 3 DCA pro rata work groups and 2 Director, Board Members and Advisory tele-conference meetings. The goal of these meetings is for us to break those silos and ensure there is a cross pollination between the programs. Director Grafilo stated his goal is to create an organization without those silos. The Commission does a good job about reaching out to DCA and he hopes the Commission staff are able to reach out to other agencies.

January 7th marked a new era for the State, as Governor Gavin Newsom was sworn in as the 40th Governor of California. DCA met with the Governor's transition team and are looking forward to working with the Governor. As for current appointees of the Commission, there is nothing that needs to be done, other than continuing the great work done by the Commissioners. January 10th of 2019 Governor Newsom released the budget for California and will seek to pay down debt while building a more robust reserve. DCA hosted a tele-conference with Board leadership, Executive Officers and Board Chiefs to discuss how the Governor's new budget will affect those agencies under DCA. Fiscal operations began scheduling meetings to discuss how the proposed budget changes will affect those under DCA.

Director Grafilo reminded the Commission members they are required to complete Board Member training within 1 year of appointment or reappointment to a Board. He also stated 2019 is a mandatory training year for Sexual Harassment Prevention and all employees, Board Members and Commission members are required to take the training. He wished the Commission his best at their Sunset review, and hoped they have a smooth review process.

Chair Carvelli thanked Director Grafilo for his detailed preparation process for the Sunset review and the Commission is now awaiting the final report. Chair Carvelli also welcomed Deputy Director Christopher Castrillo and thanked him for all his support as well.

Agenda Item 6-Review and Possible Action of Petition to Change the Decision for Cathilee Zingano vs. Megan Anderson bout on December 29, 2018, in Los Angeles, CA

EO Foster presented the Commission with background on the petition to change the bout decision. Megan Anderson threw a high kick towards Cathilee Zingano's face which struck her in the eye during round 1 of the bout on December 29, 2018. Referee Marc Goddard ruled the kick a legal strike and instructed Ms. Zingano to continue. Mr. Gable on behalf of Ms. Zingano is requesting the decision be changed from a TKO loss to a no contest.

EO Foster informed the Commission Mr. Goddard was in England but if they wished to speak to him, he could be reached by phone. Mr. Goddard provided a written statement which was provided to the Commission and a statement from the Association of Boxing Commissions (ABC) and Combative Sports MMA rules committee. EO Foster didn't give a

recommendation, as he was instrumental in working on the new unified rules and felt it would be a conflict of interest.

A health document was handed to the Commissioners during the meeting as it was not included in the packet. Ms. Zingano was okay with the document being added to the record. Mr. Nathan Gable was present as Ms. Zingano's representation. Megan Anderson was not present, nor did she submit any written documentation or videos.

Mr. Gable played the video from the bout on December 29, 2018, in Los Angeles. He stated you can clearly see Ms. Anderson's toe grazes across the eye socket and gets caught under Ms. Zingano's eyelid. Photographs were also submitted to the Commission along with a better description of the injury from Ms. Zingano's doctor. Mr. Gable stated there are 2 components which must be looked at; the legal strike of the toe crossing the eye socket and the toe going under the eye lid into the eye ball which is an eye gouge.

Rule number 2 of the ABC Unified MMA Rules states, "that an eye gouging of any kind (fingers, chins, elbows) is illegal, but legal strikes that contact the fighter's eye shall be considered legal." Mr. Gable further explained a strike to the eye socket or the eye is different than an eye gouge of any kind. The contact to the eye socket is very minimal and the eye gouge is accidental therefore the bout should result in a no contest. Mr. Gable pointed out in the letter from the ABC MMA rules committee it is noted the kick was legal with no intent to eye gouge, but toes aren't included in rule number 2.

Mr. Gable stated the kick to the eye socket was legal and the gouge to the eye was illegal; it's not where the kick starts out but where the kick ends makes it illegal. Both referee Marc Goddard and the ABC MMA rules committee stated it has to be intentional but nowhere in the rules is that stated. In fact, the rules mention accidentals fouls and those should result in a "no contest". Referee Marc Goddard quoted rule number 9 in his statement which is the out stretched finger rule and that rule doesn't apply to this as this was an eye gouge.

Ms. Zingano stated she didn't think this was done on purpose. Ms. Zingano stated she feels the rule is vague and could be dangerous going forward for other fighters. Chair Carvelli inquired as to how Ms. Zingano was doing. Ms. Zingano responded she was getting better but still has spots in her vision and her vision is still blurry. She stated she would like to see this rule written better moving forward for fighters. Mr. Gable closed by saying referee Marc Goddard had the power to rule this a no contest and based on his letter alone he got the rule wrong.

Commissioner Araby asked EO Foster if this was the first instance of this he had heard of. EO Foster stated this was the first time he had seen or heard of this happening. EO Foster agreed the ABC MMA rules committee should address this issue. Commissioner Araby questioned if the Commission reversed this decision would open the flood gates on decisions going forward. EO Foster stated he hadn't seen this before so he didn't think

changing the decision would open a floodgate. The language in rule number 2 is crystal clear on what constitutes a legal strike. EO Foster stated he agreed with Ms. Zingano the committee should address this issue. Commissioner Araby recommended the Commission make a recommendation to the ABC MMA rules committee for a more defined definition of eye gouging.

Commissioner Ayala stated he saw the fight and felt it was a very unfortunate situation. He asked if the Commission had any rules in place regarding how trimmed nails had to be. EO Foster stated the Commission did. Commissioner Ayala asked for more clarification on whether the eye poke had to be intentional or not.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated the current rule was modified so when a fighter's hand is at eye level they need to close their fingers otherwise, if there is an eye poke, it is an intentional foul. It is considered a deliberate act to open the hand at eye level and risk the injury to the opponent. She further stated athletes are told they must move their hands up or down if they want to open their hands, otherwise, keep their fingers closed. The rule, she said, specifically addresses fingers, elbows and chins, and states all other strikes or punches that contact the eyes are legal. Therefore, until the rule is changed or made more specific as to toes, the strike to Ms. Zingano, as unfortunate as it was, must be considered a legal strike.

EO Foster informed the Commission the inspectors have nail clippers, inspect nails, and they make sure those are available to ensure the nails are clipped.

Vice Chair Lehman thanked Mr. Gable for his letter and stated she thought it was very logical. Vice Chair Lehman asked Mr. Gable to explain what he meant when he stated rule number 2 is not a limitation. Mr. Gable stated the rule starts off saying "of any kind" and is an open-ended preface to the sentence.

Commissioner Dr. Williams asked if Mr. Gable's assertion was rule number 2 and number 9 are separate and independent of each other. Mr. Gable stated they aren't separate, but they aren't pre-requisites of each of other. Commissioner Dr. Williams stated the letter from the ABC MMA rules committee takes a different position, rule number 9 further addresses rule number 2 to help avoid eye pokes with the fingers.

Commissioner Sauter asked for EO Foster to give the Commission a summary of their options and his recommendation. EO Foster stated the Commission could let the decision stand or reverse the decision to a "no contest". The case for letting the win stand, would be the 2nd sentence of rule number 2, "legal strikes or punches that contact the eye socket are not eye gouging". The option to make it a no contest was laid out very well by Mr. Gable and EO Foster thought the argument was compelling and interesting. EO Foster stated if the commission ruled this a no contest, the Commission would be taking away a fighter's win. EO Foster recommended the decision stand as a TKO.

Vice Chair Lehman asked Commissioner Dr. Williams for some clarification. If rule number 2 states "legal strikes that connect with the fighter's eye sockets", would it be correct to assume the eye socket doesn't include the eye ball? Commissioner Dr. Williams stated he would interpret it to include the eye socket and the content.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez motioned to let the decision stand as is. Commissioner Sauter seconded the motion.

Vice Chair Lehman motioned to change the decision to a no contest. Motion died for lack of a second.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez's motion stands.

No public comments

Commissioner Araby stated he felt the Commission needed to look for a clearer definition moving forward, and he would feel uncomfortable overturning this decision without more clarity on the rules.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez thanked Ms. Zingano for her participation in the sport and for being one of the athletes who started MMA for women. Furthermore, she thanked Mr. Gable for making this argument as best as he possibly could. She felt this was an important health and safety issues, as this is how rule number 2 came about; people brought appeals and the rules were re-evaluated. She stated she's watched hundreds if not thousands of rounds of MMA and Kickboxing and has never seen this happen before. She asked MMA experts and officials and no one has ever seen or heard of this occurring. However, Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated just because we haven't seen it doesn't mean we shouldn't look into it. She was glad Ms. Zingano brought this to the Commission. The Commission asked EO to address this with the ABC MMA rules committee and report back.

Chair Carvelli stated he was at the event and it was just rotten how it ended. He wished there was more the Commission could do more to help Ms. Zingano and asked her to please not stop competing and being an ambassador to the sport.

Vice Chair Lehman pointed out the rules of statutory construction state if rules are ambiguous, the Commission can look to public policy as to the result and intent behind the rules.

The motion passed 6-1 by roll call vote (Vice-Chair Lehman voted against)

<u>Agenda Item 7-Review and Approval of changes to Examination of Boxer Applicants</u> regulation language

EO Foster informed the Commission they are close to finishing the regulation package. The last part are the changes from the legal affairs committee. Counsel Walker handed the Commission documents which state reasons for the changes to the proposed text.

Commissioner Ayala motioned to approve the amended language and direct staff to continue with the process.

Commissioner Dr. Williams seconded the motion.

Vice Chair Lehman stated the Commission wants this to go forward and they understand there is a new process. She asked for Counsel Walker to please make sure whoever takes over after he leaves not let this get buried. She also stated moving forward, the Commission had mentioned doing telephonic meetings to get this approved rather than having to wait for the next meeting.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked if this will be done before the next meeting? Counsel Walker informed the Commission it wouldn't be.

No public comments

The motion passed 7-0 by roll call vote.

Agenda Item 8- Subcommittees Updates

- a. Pension Fund Subcommittee (Commissioners Lehman and Ayala)
 - i. Report from Beth Herrington from Benefit Resources regarding the pension fund administration

Beth Herrington reported the balance in the plan at the end of 2018 was \$4,950,731, they have 287 covered boxers totaling \$3,779,840 of the plan asset and of those covered 11 were paid a total of \$176,332. 11 late claimants came forward representing \$186,075. Commissioner Sauter asked what the average payment was. Ms. Herrington stated the average is about \$15,000.

Ms. Herrington stated in the past the Commission discussed collecting more to ensure there was enough in the fund for the payouts, but they never discussed what that number should be. She also stated the plan assets are at a low, distributions have slowed down some, but we are stable with the number of participants getting paid.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked if the Commission should be worried about the amount of assets in the fund, having discussed at the beginning of the review there may come a time when the fund balance may need to be replenished? Ms. Herrington stated the concern is when over \$ 2 million is transferred to the suspense account and people come for their pay-outs when

their sums have already been transferred into the suspense account. Vice Chair Lehman asked what happens if we get 11 claimants in next the two months and we don't have the funds, does our plan address this?

Commissioner Araby summarized that according to the reports provided to the Commission, the Commission has 4.9 million in the plan balance, 3.8 million claimed and if all benefits are claimed, the Commission would have 1.1 million in assets. Where does the 1.1 million in assets go? Ms. Herrington stated the 1.1 million in the account would be for the 1,291 boxers who are working to be covered. There are 146 boxers who haven't claimed benefits whose balance exceeds 2 million. Funds from what is owed to those unclaimed boxers have been used to cover what is owed to the boxers who have claimed their benefits.

Chair Carvelli asked if Ms. Herrington had a proposal for what we could do about this? Ms. Herrington proposed the Commission increase the hold back amount from 20% to 50%. Chair Carvelli asked Ms. Herrington how she came up with that number. Ms. Herrington stated the Commission transferred \$186,000 last year, the 20% hold back left the fund with \$23,000. Almost 50% was used to pay the benefits for those that came forward last year. Commissioner Sauter asked if the process continues, where will the Commission be in 5 years? Ms. Herrington stated in 2012 the Commission adjusted and transferred \$250,000 to the suspense account and if we stay on the same trajectory the fund would be minus \$230,000.

Vice Chair Lehman thanked Ms. Herrington for getting the language that allows the Commission to change the amount of the hold back percentage. Commissioner Araby stated he was uncomfortable in deciding to change the amount of the hold back without seeing a more solid argument and reports.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked if the Commission decided to move up the amount of the holdback, how long would it take to make it happen? Ms. Herrington stated it would not take long, less than a week. Chair Carvelli asked EO Foster what his thoughts were on moving up the holdback amount to 50%. EO Foster stated he would have to defer that question to the experts. Chair Carvelli stated the Commission could authorize the EO to grant the increase after more data is reviewed or the Commission could authorize the Pension Fund Subcommittee to make that decision.

Commissioner Sauter motioned to have Ms. Herrington come back in 6 months to report on the pension fund and for the Pension Fund Subcommittee to have the authority to increase the holdback percentage.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez seconded the motioned.

Pension fund subcommittee members are Vice Chair Lehman and Commissioner Araby.

Director Grafilo stated he appreciated the Commissioners' desire to get to the root of this. He also stated he has been asked what some of the most rewarding things he has done, and without a doubt it was being able to give a former boxer his pension check.

Chair Carvelli stated there are only two pension funds in the State of California: The California Public Retirement System (CalPERS) and this one.

No further commissioner or public comment.

The motion passed 7-0 by roll call vote.

Vice Chair Lehman stated considering this is a big issue and it's something Ms. Herrington put thought in, where is it at in the report. Ms. Herrington stated it is in the expense summary in section 3. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez confirmed it was mentioned in section 3D but stated it was just a little note. She further explained she understood this because the Chair and she tore this pension plan apart 5 years ago, but the rest of the Commissioners weren't a part of the process. Therefore, these significant substantive issues need to be made clear for everyone to understand.

Ms. Herrington informed the Commission she provided EO Foster with a search service that will help locate those boxers owed money under the pension plan.

ii. Report from Cyril Shah of Raymond Jones Financial Services regarding the status of the Pension Fund investment account and allocation of assets

Reports were provided to the Commission by Cyril Shah. He stated the account is at 50% equity and the account saw a slowing in the 4th quarter. For the first time in 10 years the account saw a negative return because of the drop-in stocks and bonds.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked Mr. Shah if he re-allocated any of the funds in 2018. Mr. Shah stated assets were reallocated into domestic equities. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked Mr. Shah if he looked at the pension's performance at the beginning of the 1st quarter. He informed the Commission he did, and changes were made to insulate the fund from the volatility of the market.

Mr. Shah stated there was a significantly large increase in distributions being made and the Commission may be a need to find other ways to fund distributions. However, even though calendar year 2018saw a 4.9% dividend decline, we are still above our target.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez pointed out the report shows a 12.1% loss. Mr. Shah stated it was because of the drop to the MSCI, one of the most volatile investments in the profile, which is related to what is happening in Europe. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked if there is a way to measure how our pension fund is doing compared to others? Mr. Shah stated they use benchmarks to track how the fund is doing.

Mr. Shah reported if the fund sees a large influx in payouts to boxers during a down period it would eat away at the principal and it wouldn't have the opportunity get back to where it was. That would create inequity to a boxer who came forward 5 years ago compared to a boxer who came forward during a down period.

Commissioner Sauter asked, if one fighter would get a certain amount money but if another fighter came forward during a down period he would get less money? Commissioner Araby asked for Mr. Shah to define whether the plan is a contribution plan or a defined benefit plan. Mr. Shah stated the pension fund made the transition from a defined benefit plan to a defined contribution plan. If we define the benefit and all boxers come forward, then the pension would be unstable, by changing the plan we were able to ensure boxers who came forward were able to get their fair share.

Commissioner Sauter stated boxers don't know what type of plan we have, and they don't know about fluctuations. He stated he felt there are equity deficiencies in the plan if a boxer comes in during a bad period. Mr. Shah stated they are ways to minimize the volatility and help grow the fund. They have been successful in making sure the value of the fund stays even, despite the number of payouts.

Chair Carvelli informed the Commission the fund is stable and as the fund balance increases, the Commission can continue giving out money to the boxers, as that is the purpose of the fund.

Reassessment of criteria for eligibility

Tabled to the next meeting so the Pension fund subcommittee has a chance to meet.

<u>Agenda Item 9-Discussion and Possible Action of creation of Pension Benefits for</u> Mixed Martial Arts Athletes

Chair Carvelli wanted to get a sense form the Commission if this was something they needed to look at and discuss more. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated she and EO Foster had talked about this over the years. It is a complicated issue but is possible. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated she wasn't sure if they would need to bring in a non-profit or look at going to the ABC level. She recommended the Commission look at creating a subcommittee for a detailed look into this.

Chair Carvelli stated he was comfortable with the actions taken today with regards to the boxers' pension fund. Vice Chair Lehman asked the Commission to create a subcommittee to investigate creating the same for MMA, she nominated Commissioner Shen-Urquidez. Chair Carvelli nominated Commissioner Ayala for the subcommittee. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez and Commissioner Ayala accepted

Vice Chair Lehman asked if the pension fund subcommittee had the authority to instruct Ms. Herrington to increase the holdback percentage amount. EO Foster stated yes and informed the Commission \$300,000 was just requested from Mr. Shah for payouts. EO Foster informed the Commission they are in the process of working on getting a contract with a company to assist in locating those boxers. Commissioner Sauter asked if the Commission should look at using some internal resource on these matters? Chair Carvelli stated instead of hiring someone, the Commission could reach out the Department to see if they have resources available.

Agenda Item 10-Executive Officer's Report

a. <u>Budget Update for the support Fund, the Neurological Fund, and Pension Program</u>

The EO presented to the Commission the updated revenue numbers as of the morning of December 11, 2018. The Commission has deposited into the support fund \$1,645,000, the neurological fund \$8,889.38, and \$261,663.52 into the Boxers pension fund. The Commission is well above 1.9 million in deposits, the Commission is budgeted for 1.7 million. EO Foster is not certain how much has been spent but EO Foster stated the Commission is revenue positive. The FI\$CAL system is not working which is why EO Foster can't present the Commission with a definite number of how much has been spent.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked if there was an ETA on when the FI\$CAL system would be ready? Chris Castrillo with DCA stated they expect to have the FI\$CAL numbers by the end of March 2019.

Chair Carvelli stated EO Foster has a good idea of what the Commission's expenses are and EO Foster has done a good job of budgeting. The fiscal state of

this Commission is a good one. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated it would be nice to just have a better understanding down to the dollar.

EO Foster presented the Commission with charts on the fund condition, showing the Commission is having a record year.

b. Report on pending and proposed Regulations

EO Foster stated the Commission discussed this in Agenda item #7. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated she understood they have now streamlined process, but the process is still taking too long. Commissioner Araby inquired about the process involving regulation packages. EO Foster gave the Commission a summary of the steps involved and will provide the Commission with the regulation timeline.

Chris Castrillo stated he understands the process takes a lot of time and the hope is the proposed regulation unit will assist in streamlining the process. Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated when the Commission went through the process in the past, it seemed as if the people reviewing the proposed regulations didn't understand what the Commission does. Perhaps it was a function of the Commission having the opportunity to do better outreach with DCA and Agency so we are on the same page.

c. Status update of Delegated Entities

California Amateur Mixed Martial Arts Organizations (CAMO) JT Steele, President of CAMO, presented the Commission with his report, which is contained in the meeting materials. He stated CAMO is off to a busy start with 4 events in the upcoming weekend. Mr. Steele informed the Commission CAMO will be able to have their amateur drug testing done and he thanked Commissioner Shen-Urquidez, the Contact Sports Foundation, and EO Foster for their help with this.

Mr. Steele wanted to publicly thank the CAMO officials for all of their hard work. Chair Carvelli asked Mr. Steele to summarize his financial situation. Mr. Steele stated CAMO is stable and busy.

USA Boxing (USA Boxing)

Mr. Mike McAtee presented the Commission with his written report, which is contained in the meeting materials. Mr. McAtee asked the Commission if could be able to present his reports to the Commission quarterly, the Commission agreed that would be fine. Mr. McAtee informed the Commission in 2018 USA Boxing sanctioned 158 bouts, 191 competition days. The Southern California is the largest LBC in the country, USA Boxing is proud of the LBC.

Mr. McAtee informed the Commission in March of 2019, USA Boxing will begin their new coaching training program which will address nutrition and weight cutting. USA Boxing has been working closely with the Police Athletic league and are helping them to expand their program.

EO Foster asked Mr. McAtee to explain why so much money is being spent on the elite level athletes and if the report is correct regarding the amount of money spent on the female athletes compared to the male athletes. Mr. McAtee stated the discrepancy regarding the youth male and females boxers may be a misprint Chair Carvelli asked he look into this and report back at the next Commission meeting. Mr. McAtee stated the high-performance boxers participate year-round which is why more money is allocated towards them.

Chair Carvelli pointed out women's participation is in increasing and the Commission appreciates the detailed reports are now being provided by USA Boxing.

United States Fight League (USFL)

Jon Frank submitted his report to the Commission, which is contained in the meeting materials. Mr. Frank informed the Commission two amateur sanctioning mixed martial arts organizations have joined together and will have a youth division. That organization has conceded to removing head strikes from the youth division. The new leadership program was developed has entered Phase II and they are interviewing some of the participants and parents. Mr. Frank informed the Commission once kids have competed in 10 bouts and are recommended they will receive rings with their names on them.

EO Foster stated this Commission took the lead on this and it is a big deal that these international bodies are adopting the rules the Commission created.

International Kickboxing Federation (IKF)

Steve Fossum, President of IKF, submitted his report to the Commission which is contained in the meeting materials. Mr. Fossum stated they have had a couple of new promoters in 2018 and those promoters have been great to work with.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez stated she is happy to see all the organizations working together. EO Foster pointed out since the Commission has delegated authority to IKF they have done 232 events.

d. Update on C3 Logix Sports Concussion Management Program

EO Foster presented the Commission the brief background of the C3 Logix system and informed the Commission they have tested a large quantity of the participants. EO Foster stated the Commission is now ready to move onto Phase II, a spreadsheet was presented showing where C3 Logix will be added. He stated when shows are being worked in the office the staff will now input whether the athlete needs to do a test or the date of the athletes last date. Commissioner Dr. Williams added this great and repeat testing will be a part of Phase II, the hope is some of the information will assist the Commission in better evaluating fighters. Chair Carvelli asked for Commissioner Dr. Williams to send those points to EO Foster. Chair Carvelli stated the hopes that some of these items will be presented at the Sunset review hearing.

Commissioner Shen-Urquidez asked if it was possible to use this data to customize a return to play for each athlete instead of using the current arbitrary dates since this was the original reason for obtaining the concussion system and the mandate for it. Commissioner Dr. Williams stated in the future it could be possible and maybe could be used as in incentive to get the athletes to participant.

e. Staffing Update

EO Foster introduced new Commission employee Patrisha Blackstock. EO Foster informed the Commission there is one vacant position but at this time the Commission doesn't have the appropriation to fill the position.

f. Association of Boxing Commissions Ratings Criteria Update

EO Foster informed the Commission the World Boxing Council (WBC) and the International Boxing Federation (IBF) have internal regulations that exceed the health and safety provisions regarding extreme weight cutting in the ABC ratings criteria.

EO Foster requested Spencer Walker send letters to the World Boxing Organization (WBO) and the World Boxing Association (WBA). The WBO has responded they intend to fully comply with the new health and safety provisions regarding weight cutting that have been tied to the ratings criteria. The World Boxing Association (WBA) has not responded as of this date.

EO Foster informed the Commission he is looking into the enforcement aspect of the rating criteria update.

g. <u>Association of Boxing Commission (ABC) Report of Number of Show</u> Regulated

EO Foster stated California is number one, but of note is the sharp increase in the number of boxing shows regulated. In 2017, the Commission regulated 87 boxing

events compared to 118 boxing events in 2018. The Commission regulated more boxing events in 2018 than Texas, New York, New Jersey, and Nevada combined.

EO Foster presented the Commission with a graphically breakdown of the number of shows, type of shows and revenue of each show held in California. EO Foster pointed out that a great deal of the shows are now being streamed on many of the different streaming services.

h. Upcoming Event Schedule and discussion regarding event activity
EO Foster stated the Commission has 2 major Bellator events coming up, a world title fight at Fantasy Springs and several Combate events scheduled. EO Foster informed the Commission on April 12th Lomachenko would be fighting at the Staples Center and on March 9th Shawn Porter would be fighting at Dignity Health Sports Park.

Agenda Item 11 – Business and Professions Code section 18640.5 requires the Commission to invite stakeholder testimony at Commission meetings in order to identify actions that may lead to greater opportunities for licensees to participate in major professional boxing contests

No stakeholder comments received.

Agenda Item 12 - Public Comment on Items Not on the Agenda

Public Comments were given regarding amateur mixed martial arts and neurological testing.



BACKGROUND

On March 23,2019 in Costa Mesa, California, Jenny Ravalo, a reporter for Vegas Sports Daily was interviewing Kubrat Pulev after his bout against Bogdan Dinu. During the interview Mr. Pulev kissed Ms. Ravalo on the mouth without her consent.

On March 26, 2019, I placed Mr. Pulev on administrative suspension for a violation of California Code of Regulations, title 4, section 390 (Discredit to Boxing). A suspension letter was mailed to Mr. Pulev via certified mail on March 26, 2019.

On March 28, 2019, Sophia Cornejo and I met with DCA's Division of Investigations (DOI) to go over the details of the incident and I requested that DOI do an investigation of the incident and provide a report back to the Commission.

Ms. Ravalo's legal counsel submitted a request on March 28, 2019 asking that Mr. Pulev's boxing license be suspended and that the Commission investigate the incident.

An appeal and request for a hearing in front of the Commission was submitted by Mr. Pulev's legal counsel on March 30, 2019.

Dear Mr. Pulev:

The California State Athletic Commission is placing you on an administrative suspension for your behavior at the event on March 23, 2019, in Costa Mesa, California. The behavior was unprofessional and is a violation of California Code of Regulations section 390. You are required to appear before the Commission to regarding this matter.

§ 390. Violations of Laws or Rules.

Any licensee who violates the laws of the State of California, with the exception of minor traffic violations, or the rules of the Athletic Commission, or who fails or refuses to comply with a valid order of a commission representative, or who conducts himself or herself at any time or place in a manner which is deemed by the commission to reflect discredit to boxing, may have his or her license revoked, or may be fined, suspended or otherwise disciplined in such manner as the commission may direct.

Per Business and Professions Code 18842, you have a right to appeal this suspension before the Commission. You must submit your appeal request, in writing, within 30 days of the date of this letter. Upon receipt of the request, your appeal will be included on the agenda for the next available Commission meeting.



Dear Mr. Foster:

We represent IBF No. 1 Mandatory Challenger Kubrat Pulev.

Reference is made to your letter to Mr. Pulev dated March 26, 2019 placing him on a temporary administrative suspension because his "behavior was unprofessional" at the event on March 23, 2019 in Costa Mesa, California and finding that such behavior violated Section 390 of the California Code of Regulations because it reflects a "discredit to boxing."

Although your letter did not specify what specific behavior the Commission found that Mr. Pulev allegedly engaged in that reflected a "discredit to boxing," we assume from the recent media reports that it relates to Mr. Pulev's kiss with a female reporter, Jenny Ravalo a/k/a Jenny SuShe, who Mr. Pulev believed was his friend, after she finished a post-fight interview with him.

After Ms. Ravalo posted the video on the Internet, despite Mr. Pulev's request that she delete the kiss from the video of the interview, it went viral. Mr. Pulev, released a statement explaining the video:

Ms. Ravalo hired Gloria Allred, and on March 28, 2019, Ms. Allred held a news conference in California with Ms. Ravalo that was streamed live worldwide on Ms. Allred's firm's FaceBook page:

STATEMENT OF JENNY BAYALO March 22nd 2013 I was at the mangar OC event center in Costa Mesa California, when I met Kub at Puley for the first time even, i was there for the weightin. I asked him if we could do an interview for Vegas Sports Daily. He said "Yes". We did a pre-fight interview. The next day, March 23rd, 2019 after the fight between Kubrat and Bogdan Dinu if asked Kubrat for a post-right interview. He said Mes. I conducted the interview in a backstage area inside his tent. I started the interview Mid-interview he prophed inv. face and cased me. I was immediately snocked and embairassed, and didn't know how to respond Next. I warked to the table to put my items in my backpack. He grabbed both of my buttooks and squeezed with both of his hands. Then he salked away is thout saying anything to me and laughed it made me fee and mile table and instrated that Kobrat Polevinous aleating in south an unproressional manner. I did not encourage or consent to Mr. Puley grabbing my face, kissing me, or grabbing my backside. I was there at the event covering the boxing match as a professional member of the press. Kissing a koman on her iligs without her consent and graboling her is not acceptable Later that hight, a friend invited me to an after-party. There was an opportunity to interview more fighters and therefore I decided to do Mr. Puley did not join until the very end of the hight. He acted like nothing happened but later at the party he asked me to remove the kiss from the interview. I did not remove it

party he asked me to re-nove the kiss from the interview. Fidid not remove it and instead posted it secause I wanted geope to see what he had come to me. I wanted him to be accountable if cidn't want him to get a way with it. What he ord to me was disgusting. I fe't humiliated No woman should be treated this way, Mr. Puler and I were not friends and we were not in a romantic relationship. He had no right to kiss me.

I contacted Giorra A lived because I fet that Mis. Alterdiopulding in mempose

consequences on Mr. Puley for what he did to me. I never had this happen to me before and I never want it to happen again. A manishould ask a woman before he kisses her. That did not happen in this encounter with Mr. Puley and that eighty I misceaking out today.

JENNY RAVALO REPRESENTED BY ATTORNEY GLOPIA ALLRED MARCH 28 2019

In her statement, Ms. Ravalo states what Mr. Pulev did "was disgusting" and that she did not "encourage" Mr. Pulev's kissing her. She further states that she was not "friends" with Mr. Pulev and that she decided to go to the post-fight party because "[t]here was an opportunity to interview other fighters."

The Commission is undoubtedly aware of a number of photographs, videos and other evidence that has been posted on the Internet following Ms. Allred's press conference that reveal that Mr. Pulev's account of events is accurate and that Ms. Ravalo's public statement is misleading, deceptive and mendacious, and that she is "playing the victim" in order to garner her 15-minutes of fame.

The intimacy of the photos below and the video of the post-fight party that have been posted today on the Internet, establish that Mr. Pulev was right in his initial belief that Jenny was his friend:

Ms. Ravalo's account of events--that she only went to the post-fight party to interview other fighters--is belied by the video and the fact that during the 5+ hours she was at the post-fight party, she did not conduct any interviews according to Tervel Pulev, Kubrat Pulev's brother, who was present at the post-fight party the entire time Ms. Ravalo was.

Furthermore, when I personally arrived in the hotel lobby at 6 am Sunday morning to check out on my way to the airport after the fight, the party was still going on in the lobby. I saw Kubrat and went over to talk to him. He introduced me to his "friend" Jenny who was sitting next to him on the sofa. Given the way they interacted with each other, it was quite apparent to me that there was a relationship between them and that they were friends. She and I and Kubrat chatted for a few minutes. During our chat, Jenny was not upset and in fact was very friendly towards Kubrat. She kept saying how awesome he was and what a great fight he had had.

Ms. Ravalo's statement that Mr. Pulev "did not join [the post-fight party] until the very end of the night" is belied by the time stamp of the video (3 am) and the fact that she was still partying with Mr. Pulev and his team three hours later at 6 am when I checked out.

Ms. Ravalo also failed to disclose that prior to the post-fight party in the hotel lobby, she went to dinner with Tervel Pulev and Kubrat's other friends at a club near the site hotel after the fight. This photo was taken at the dinner table at the club:



Kubrat was not at this dinner because he had gone to the hospital to get his cut stitched. He arrived to the party in the hotel lobby at approximately 2 am. Tervel, Ms. Ravalo and Mr. Pulev's other friends were already there having arrived at the hotel after their dinner at the club.

In a text message that Ms. Ravalo sent a friend later on Sunday, when the friend asked if she had had a good time, Ms. Ravalo texted the friend "Ya!" and then unprompted, proceeded to send her the video of the post-fight interview. Notably, there is no further text with the video (where Ms. Ravalo could have said something negative about the video, but did not).



In any event, Mr. Pulev's kiss with Ms. Ravalo does not rise to a "sexual assault" under California law. The California statute requires the offender to touch "an intimate part" of another person. Cal. Penal Code § 243.4(e)(1) (West, Westlaw through 2009 Sess.) The statute defines this term as including "the sexual organ, anus, groin, or buttocks of any person, and the breast of a female." Id. § 243.4(g). The statute's omission of the words "lips" or "neck" as an intimate part of the body means that Mr. Pulev's kiss cannot be a "sexual assault" under California law.

Section 18842 of the California Business and Professions Code empowers,

[t]he commission, the executive officer and other employees duly authorized by the executive officer, . . . to suspend temporarily, any license until final determination by the commission when, in his or her opinion, the action is <u>necessary to protect the public welfare or is in the best interest of boxing</u> or martial arts.

Mr. Pulev's due process rights have been abrogated as a result of the Commission's temporary suspension. We submit that Mr. Pulev's suspension is not "necessary" to protect the public welfare nor is it in the best interest of boxing given these circumstances. The material evidence is clear that it is Mr. Pulev who is the victim of Mr. Ravalo's improper attempt to "play the victim" under the #MeToo movement.

We respectfully submit that under the circumstances, the temporary suspension should be immediately vacated. If, after a fair and impartial hearing on May 14, 2019, the Commission determines that Mr. Pulev should nonetheless be suspended or otherwise punished for the kiss, while we do not believe that there in fact exist any such grounds, at least Mr. Pulev will have been given due process and a chance to confront his accuser and be heard.

Mr. Pulev's mistake was trusting someone who he thought was his friend, and who he believed would have been receptive to a kiss, but who really had an ulterior motive. He had just won a big fight—his first in the United States, was elated and believed, based on Ms. Ravalo's prior interactions with him, that she would be receptive to a kiss. It was not meant to be broadcast around the world. Ms. Ravalo made these false accusations for financial gain and/or fame and made the video public for her own personal agenda, not because she "didn't want him to get away with it."

Boxing is Mr. Pulev's life. He wants the Commission to know that he would never do anything intentionally to hurt his beloved sport and that he fights for honor and country, not money. He now realizes that there are people who will try to use his fame and position for their own improper and ulterior purposes.

For the foregoing reasons, we respectfully request that the Commission vacate Mr. Pulev's temporary suspension and that he be permitted to present his case at the hearing on May 14, 2019. We are confident that Mr. Pulev will prevail and will be found innocent of any wrongdoing.

Please be advised that this letter does not purport to be a complete statement of the facts or the law with respect to this matter and is without prejudice to any of our client's rights, interests or remedies at law, in equity or otherwise, all of which are hereby expressly reserved.



Dear Mr. Foster:

Please be advised that our law firm represents Ms. Jenny Ravalo, a reporter for Vegas Sports Daily.

On March 22, 2019, Ms. Ravalo conducted a pre-fight interview with boxer Kubrat Pulev in preparation for the March 23, 2019 boxing match in Costa Mesa, CA in which Mr. Pulev was a participant. Shortly after the conclusion of the March 23, 2019 boxing match, Ms. Ravalo conducted a post-fight interview of Mr. Pulev. During said interview, Mr. Pulev suddenly grabbed Ms. Ravalo's face and kissed her. Said assault was unwelcomed and unlawful. A video of said unwanted kissing was documented in a video that went viral and can be viewed by the Commission. Following the post-fight interview, Ms. Ravalo walked to a nearby table to put items into her backpack. She alleges that at that time Mr. Pulev, without Ms. Ravalo's consent, suddenly grabbed both of her buttocks and squeezed them, and thereafter Mr. Pulev walked away and laughed, leaving Ms. Ravalo in shock.

Ms. Ravalo was at the March 23, 2019 boxing event as a member of the press covering the match in her professional capacity. Mr. Pulev's disgusting behavior towards her was unlawful and unprofessional.

Business and Profession code section 18602.1 states:

"Protection of the public shall be the highest priority for the State Athletic Commission in exercising its licensing, regulatory and disciplinary functions. Whenever the protection of the public is inconsistent with other interests sought to be promoted, the protection of the public shall be paramount."

Furthermore, CCR section 390 states in part:

"Any licensee who violates the laws of the State of California...or the rules of the Athletic Commission...or who conducts himself or herself at any time or place in a manner which is deemed by the Commission to reflect discredit to boxing, may have his or her license revoked, or may be fined, suspended or otherwise disciplined in such manner as the Commission may direct."

Mr. Pulev's reprehensible conduct and battery described above violates California law as well as the rules of the Athletic Commission.

We hereby request that the Commission conduct an immediate investigation into the serious allegations herein. It is my understanding that the next Commission hearing is set for May 14, 2019 in Los Angeles. Pending said hearing, we request that Mr. Pulev's boxing license be suspended. We also respectfully request that the Commission place this issue and Mr. Pulev's conduct on the agenda of the May 14, 2019 hearing, and that Ms. Ravalo and I be permitted to testify on that issue before the Commission at that hearing.

We would greatly appreciate your attention to this matter and we look forward to your response.

BACKGROUND

On March 28, 2019, the Commission received a formal petition to change a decision from Greg Cohen on behalf of Bogdan Dinu. The bout occurred at The Hanger in Costa Mesa on March 23, 2019 and ended with Kubrat Pulev winning by knockout in round 7 at 2:40.

During the bout referee Raul Caiz Sr. took 1 point from Mr. Pulev during round 7 for an unintentional foul and Mr. Dinu was allowed up to 5 minutes to recover from the foul. The ringside physician was brought in to asses Mr. Dinu and after taking time to recover, Mr. Dinu stated that he was able to continue boxing. Later in round 7, Mr. Dinu was knocked down with a legal punch and was able to continue boxing before Referee Caiz Sr. finished his count. The bout was stopped by Referee Caiz Sr. when Mr. Dinu was knocked down again during round 7 and was unable to continue.

APPEAL DETAIL SUMMARY

Mr. Cohen on behalf of Mr. Dinu, claims that during the bout Mr. Pulev repeatedly struck Mr. Dinu with illegal blows behind the head, after a series of punches including punches to the back of Mr. Dinu's head he went down on his knees. While Mr. Dinu was down, Mr. Pulev punched Mr. Dinu with a downward angle right hand to the back of the head. Referee Raul Caiz Sr. ruled the punch as an accidental foul and gave Mr. Dinu five minutes to recover. Mr. Cohen claims that the foul resulted in Mr. Dinu's inability to continue competing at the same level before the foul occurred. Mr. Cohen claims that Mr. Pulev should have been disqualified and requests that the Commission declare the bout a "no contest".

Mr. Cohen provided a PowerPoint presentation and video footage of the bout for the Commission to review.

RECOMMENDATION

While I do not believe that the punch at the 37 second mark of round 7 was a "continuation" of a combination, I feel strongly that the overall outcome of the bout would not have changed whether the foul was ruled intentional or unintentional. EO Foster recommends that the decision of Raul Caiz Sr. to award the fight to Mr. Pulev by knockout stand as is.

334. Persons Allowed in Ring.

No persons other than the contestants and the referee may be in the ring during the progress of a round.

§ 335. Referee - Instruction.

The referee shall call contestants together, either in the ring or in another appropriate location before each bout for final instructions, at which time each contestant shall be accompanied by his or her designated chief second only.

§ 337. Fouls in Boxing.

- (1) Hitting below the hip line.
- (2) Hitting an opponent who is down, is getting up after being down or who is hanging helplessly over the ropes.
- (3) Holding an opponent with one hand and hitting with the other.
- (4) Excessive holding or deliberately maintaining a clinch.
- (5) Wrestling, kicking, or biting.
- (6) Grabbing and/or holding the ropes.
- (7) Butting with the head or shoulder.
- '8) Hitting with the open glove, or with the butt of the hand, the wrist, the forearm, the elbow, the knee, and all backhand blows.
- (9) Deliberate use of the rabbit punch (hitting behind the head).
- (10) Striking deliberately at that part of the body over the kidneys.
- (11) Spinning and hitting.
- (12) Excessive taunting, abusive language or gestures.
- (13) Any unsportsmanlike act.
- (14) Hitting on the break.
- (15) Hitting after the bell has sounded ending the round, including the last round.
- (16) Hitting an opponent who is entangled in the ropes.
- (17) Pushing an opponent.
- (18) Continuous dropping of the mouthpiece.
- (19) Striking a blow during intervention by the referee under Rule 349.

§ 338. Intentional Fouling.

(a) In the case of an intentional foul, the referee may interrupt the bout for the purpose of allowing the injured boxer time to recover.

(b) Any boxer guilty of an intentional foul shall be penalized one or more points as determined by the referee. If the injured boxer is unable to continue, the offending boxer shall be disqualified, his or her purse may be withheld, and he or she may be subject to suspension. Disposition of the purse and the penalty to be imposed upon the boxer shall be determined by action of the commission or the commission's representative.

§ 339. Unintentional Fouling.

- (a) When a bout is interrupted due to an injury caused by an unintentional foul, the referee in consultation with the ringside physician shall determine whether the boxer who has been fouled can continue or not. If the referee sees, or if after consultation with the judges, determines that a boxer is unintentionally fouled and if the boxer's chance of winning has not been seriously jeopardized as a result of a foul, the referee may order the bout continued after a reasonable interval.
- (b) If the referee and/or the ringside physician determine that the bout may not continue because of an injury suffered as the result of an unintentional foul or because of an injury inflicted by an unintentional foul which later becomes aggravated by fair blows, the bout must be declared a draw if the bout is stopped before the bell rings to begin the fourth round. After the bell rings to begin the fourth round, the outcome shall be determined by scoring the completed rounds and the round during which the referee or ringside physician stopped the bout.
- (c) When an unintentional foul causes the bout to be interrupted for the purpose of allowing the injured boxer time to recover, the referee shall penalize the boxer guilty of the foul one or more points.

§ 340. Method of Scoring When There Is an Injury Not Resulting from a Foul.

- (a) If the referee determines that the injured fighter was responsible for his own injury, the referee will not penalize his opponent in any manner. In this case, if the referee or ringside physician determines that the injured fighter is unable to continue, he will lose by "technical knockout."
- (b) If the referee determines that no fault was attributable to either fighter, the referee shall allow the injured fighter reasonable recovery time, not to exceed 5 minutes. If, at the end of the recovery period, the referee or the ringside physician determines that the injured fighter cannot continue, the bout will be decided on the score cards if the bell has rung to begin the fourth round or, if the bell has not rung to start the fourth round, the bout will be called a technical draw.

Kubrat Pulev ("Respondent" or "Pulev"), by and through his undersigned attorneys, hereby files this his response in opposition to the Petition For Change of Decision Under 4 CCR § 368 (the "Petition") by Greg Cohen Promotions, LLC ("Petitioner" or "GCP")) with respect to the Kubrat Pulev vs. Bogdan Dinu ("Dinu") bout (the "Bout") that took place on March 23, 2019 at The Hangar in Costa Mesa, California, and in support thereof, states as follows:

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A. Greg Cohen Promotions Does Not Have Standing to Protest Bout.

Section 368(b) of the Professional Boxing Rules (the "PBR") set out in the California Code of Regulations (4 CCR § 368(b)) provides the procedure for an allegedly aggrieved boxer to petition the California State Athletic Commission ("CSAC") to change a decision with respect to a bout: "A petition to change a decision shall be in writing and filed by <u>a boxer or the boxer's manager</u> within five (5) calendar days from the date the decision was rendered."

It is undisputed that the Petition was not filed by Dinu or his manager and therefore does not comply with Section 368(b). Under Section 368(b) only the boxer or his manager have standing to challenge the outcome of a decision. A boxer's promoter is not authorized to file a petition under Section 368. GCP is clearly identified in the Petition as being the "Promoter of Bogdan Dinu." GCP is not licensed in California as a manager and the Petition clearly sets forth that it is being filed by GCP as Dinu's promoter:

Pelitioner Name: Greg Cohon Promotions LLC (Pronuter of Bogdan Anu)

GCP is not authorized and therefore has no standing to file the Petition on behalf of Dinu and therefore the Petition should be denied.

B. The Alleged Fouls

In the Petition, GCP alleges that "Pulev repeatedly struck Bogdan Dinu with illegal blows behind the head. After a series of blows including punches that landed behind the head Dinu was on his knees on the canvas when Pulev struck him." In the supplemental PowerPoint GCP provided to the CSAC on April 18, 2019 (the "GCP PowerPoint"), GCP specifies the following as the fouls that Pulev committed:

- 1. Hitting an opponent who is knocked down
- 2. Hitting an opponent below the navel or behind the ear
- 3. Using the pivot blow or the rabbit punch (punches thrown to the back of the head or neck area)

Section 337 of the PBR sets out the list of the various fouls in boxing recognized by the CSAC and include the following:

- (1) Hitting below the hip line.
- (2) Hitting an opponent who is down

* * *

- (9) Deliberate use of the rabbit punch (hitting behind the head).
- It should be noted that the while hitting below the belt and hitting an opponent who is down do not consider the boxer's intent in determining whether a foul occurred, to be guilty of the foul of hitting behind the head requires the "deliberate" use of that punch.

While the GCP PowerPoint references hitting an opponent below the navel or behind the ear, nowhere in either the Petition nor in the GCP PowerPoint does GCP discuss Pulev committing a foul by hitting Dinu below the "navel" or behind the "ear."

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Indeed, the list of fouls in the PBR does not utilize the terms "navel" or "ear." Because the Petition and GCP PowerPoint are limited to claims that Pulev hit Dinu with rabbit punches and while he was down, those fouls are addressed below.

C. Hitting Behind the Head

In its Petition, GCP alleges that "Pulev repeatedly struck Bogdan Dinu with illegal blows behind the head." As noted above, hitting a boxer behind his head is not "illegal" unless it is established that the boxer was "deliberately" trying to hit his opponent behind his head. In other words, to be guilty of this foul under the PBR, there must be a finding that the boxer intentionally tried to hit his opponent behind his head. GCP's argument that Pulev's "illegal" blows require a change in the decision is unavailing because there was in fact no finding by the referee or CSAC that Pulev committed the foul of the "deliberate use of the rabbit punch."

The video clip (the "Clip") of the footage from the Bout submitted by GCP as evidence as part of the GCP PowerPoint, 1 shows that Dinu was crouching down and leaning forward in an extremely unusual and awkward defensive posture to evade Pulev's punches. It is while Dinu is in this unusual crouching position that some of Pulev's punches inadvertently strike Dinu in the back of the head. The footage of these punches does not establish, however, that Pulev was deliberately trying to hit

Dinu in the back of his head—rather, the footage establishes the opposite--that Pulev was hesitant, was aiming and waiting for the right moment to punch so that he would be able to throw a clean blow (see, Clip at 0:12). It was Dinu's unusual head movement and crouching style which made it extremely difficult for Pulev to throw a punch and not inadvertently hit the back of Dinu's head.

Because the foul of hitting behind the head requires the conduct to be

Because the foul of hitting behind the head requires the conduct to be deliberate, and because the only time that Pulev hit Dinu behind the head was when Dinu was in his awkward crouching position and the footage from the bout shows Pulev's hesitation when trying to throw clean blows while Dinu was crouching, Pulev should not be found guilty of the foul of hitting his opponent behind the head.

D. Hitting an Opponent Who is Down

In the Petition, GCP also alleges that "Dinu was on his knees on the canvas when Pulev struck him." Section 337(2) of the PBR provides that "[h]itting an opponent who is down" is a foul.


Section 339 of the PBR addresses unintentional fouling and provides that,


- (a) When a bout is interrupted due to an injury caused by an unintentional foul, the referee in consultation with the ringside physician shall determine whether the boxer who has been fouled can continue or not. If the referee sees, or if after consultation with the judges, determines that a boxer is unintentionally fouled and if the boxer's chance of winning has not been seriously jeopardized as a result of a foul, the referee may order the bout continued after a reasonable interval.
- (b) If the referee and/or the ringside physician determine that the bout may not continue because of an injury suffered as the result

of an unintentional foul or because of an injury inflicted by an unintentional foul which later becomes aggravated by fair blows, the bout must be declared a draw if the bout is stopped before the bell rings to begin the fourth round. After the bell rings to begin the fourth round, the outcome shall be determined by scoring the completed rounds and the round during which the referee or ringside physician stopped the bout.


(c) When an unintentional foul causes the bout to be interrupted for the purpose of allowing the injured boxer time to recover, the referee shall penalize the boxer guilty of the foul one or more points.


Stills from the Clip do not conclusively establish if Dinu's knee was touching the canvas when Pulev hit him. The following stills are taken just before Pulev is about to hit Dinu before he goes down, and as can been seen at 0:21 and 0:35 on said Clip, from these angles, it is not clear that Dinu's knee is touching the canvas (note that the referee's hand is the top photo is still on the rope and he has not yet started to move to intervene once he sees Dinu's knee touch the canvas):





In the following stills taken right after Pulev hit Dinu with the punch while Dinu was allegedly down (*see* Clip at 0:22 and 0:37), the referee only starts to signal to stop punching <u>after</u> Pulev throws the punch. Presumably, the referee only starts to signal the boxers to stop once he sees Dinu's knee on the canvas, but by that point, Pulev's punch had been completed (note the referee's hand at bottom of second photo below):





After Dinu was knocked down, the referee called "time" and the Bout was suspended for approximately 2 minutes and 21 seconds. During the suspension, the ringside physician entered the ring, in accordance with Section 339 of the PBR, and the referee and the ringside physician examined Dinu. After examining Dinu, the referee advises Dinu "we'll give you a couple of minutes to get ready." The referee then walks to the CSAC side of the ring to inform the CSAC what had happened stating, "knockdown, he hit him behind the back of the head. It was a continuation so it was an accidental foul. But hopefully he will be able to continue, if not, we'll go to the scorecards. Accidental foul."

The referee then returns to speak with Dinu, asking him "are you Ok." Dinu responds, "Yeah." The ringside physician also then approaches Dinu with the referee present and asks him "What's your name?" Dinu responds "Bogdan." The ringside physician then asks Dinu, "where are you from?" Dinu responds, "Romania." Finally,

the ringside physician asks Dinu, "OK, do you want to continue fighting?" Dinu responds, "yeah."


During the Bout, the referee clearly rules that the foul was accidental, that the punch was a "continuation" of punch that Pulev had already started to throw, and that the Bout could continue, particularly after Dinu tells the ringside physician, with the referee present, that he wanted to continue fighting. Under these circumstances, the decision on the Bout should not be changed.

E. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

Under Section 368(b) of the PBR, GCP does not have standing to file the Petition, and therefore it should be denied on procedural grounds. Even if, however, the CSAC were to consider the merits of GCP's Petition, the evidence establishes that the referee complied with the PBR and that there are no valid grounds for the decision on the Bout to be changed.

§ 358. Announcing Winner.

At the termination of all boxing bouts the winner shall be announced by the announcer and the referee shall raise the winner's hand.

§ 360. Abuse of Officials.

No licensee shall verbally or physically abuse an official or commission representative.

§ 361. Seconds: Number and Costume.

Each contestant may have four seconds of the contestant's choice and each such second while assisting in the boxer's corner shall present a neat and tidy appearance. Only one of the seconds may be inside the ring ropes between rounds with no more than two seconds on the apron. One second must remain on the floor.

§ 362. Excessive Coaching.

A second shall not excessively coach a boxer during a round and shall remain seated and silent when so directed by the commission representative on duty.

Excessive coaching may lead to point deduction by the referee, ejection from the venue, and/or disciplinary action by the commission.

§ 363. Throwing Water Prohibited.

Excessive use of water and/or ice between rounds is prohibited. The designated chief second shall be responsible to assure that the corner is dry at the start of each round.

§ 364. Determining Defeat.

A manager or chief second of a contestant may toss a towel into the ring in token of defeat. However, such manager or chief second shall follow the towel into the ring as soon as it is possible to do so.

§ 365. Fans and Towels.

Fans and swinging of towels are prohibited.

§ 368. Change of Decision.

- (a) A decision rendered at the termination of any boxing contest is final and shall not be changed unless following the rendition of a decision the commission determines that any one of the following occurred:
 - There was collusion affecting the result of any contest;
 - (2) The compilation of the scorecard of the judges, and the referee when used as a judge, shows an error which would mean that the decision was given to the wrong boxer;

- (3) There was a violation of the laws or rules and regulations governing boxing which affected the result of any contest.
- (4) The winner of a bout tested positive immediately after the bout for a substance listed in Rule 303(c).
- (b) A petition to change a decision shall be in writing and filed by a boxer or the boxer's manager within five (5) calendar days from the date the decision was rendered.
- (c) If a petition to change a decision is not filed in writing within five (5) days of the decision, the commission may, upon the vote of at least a majority of the commissioners present, hold a hearing to change the decision at any time.
- (d) If the commission determines that any of the above occurred with regards to any contest then the decision rendered shall be changed as the commission may direct.

§ 370. Commission Shall Select Referee.

The commission or its duly authorized representative shall select and assign all referees. A licensee who wishes to protest the assignment of a referee or judge, shall file a written protest with the commission at least five days prior to the scheduled contest and shall state the reason for the protest. The protesting licensee and the referee and/or judge shall be given thereafter a hearing before a commission representative and the representative shall make such disposition of the protest as the facts may justify.

§ 371. Referee's License.

(a) In order to be licensed as a referee, an applicant shall meet all the following requirements:

The Pension Fund Subcommittee and staff met on March 12, 2019, to discuss the Pension Plan and the Commissions outreach efforts for the plan. The following is a list of action items as a result of the meeting and the status of each:


- 1. Update the Potential Late Claimants list on the web COMPLETED
- 2. Bids on Locater Services Staff contacted the company that Beth Harrington suggested to perform locator services for some of our potential late claimants. Unfortunately, the Commission cannot do business with this company as they will not agree to the State of California terms and conditions for contracting with them. Staff are continuing to research companies that can perform similar services.
- 3. Social media postings regarding the Pension Plan There were several posts since our last meeting on social media that have reached thousands of people. The office has noticed an increase in pension inquiry telephone calls as a result of the social media postings.
- 4. Request from Cyril Shah (Raymond James) projections on the fund 20 years out (in order to maintain a sustainable course for the Pension Plan) *I requested this information from Cyril Shah and he agreed to put something together. This is still pending.*
- 5. Request from Beth Harrington, Pension Plan Administrator, statistics on how many fighters does the Break in Service (BIS) affect and the percentages. –*The statistics received from Ms. Harrington are as follows:*

BACKGROUND

In recent years, California has experienced an increase in the number of scheduled fights and title fights. Timekeepers play an intricate role in all these bouts, sometimes having to keep time for more than 10 bouts in one night. I recommend a pay increase for assigned licensed timekeepers. It has been more than 10 years since the last pay increase.

Below is an outline of the current and the proposed Officials Pay Scale.

Chairman Carvelli and I represented the Commission in front of the Joint Senate and Assembly Business and Professions Committees and the Assembly Arts and Entertainment Committee on February 26th. Topics of note that were discussed were the C3 Logix program, Weight cutting and dehydration in combat sports, and gender pay equity in female boxing.

The Commission approved the amended language on February 19, 2019. Commission staff rerouted the package back to Legal on March 6, 2019.








Asset Allocation Analysis

For non-retirement accounts, the following sweep options are available: RJBDP, CIP, and RJBDP with CIP. For ERISA Accounts and IRAs that are Managed Accounts, the sole sweep option available is RJBDP – RJ Bank Only. This option uses exclusively Raymond James' bank affiliate – Raymond James Bank, N.A. – as the depository institution. Sweep deposits through RJBDP – RJ Bank Only will bear a reasonable rate of interest. For IRAs that are not Managed Accounts, the available sweep options are: RJBDP and RJBDP – RJ Bank Only.

The sixth paragraph in the "Raymond James Cash Sweep Programs" section of the Master Client Agreement and the seventh paragraph in the "Raymond James Cash Sweeps Programs" section of the Raymond James Client Agreement have been revised and restated below.

"If you open additional Accounts, you direct that: RJBDP with CIP be utilized for non-retirement Accounts, RJBDP – RJ Bank Only be utilized for ERISA Accounts and IRAs that are Managed Accounts, and RJBDP be utilized for IRAs that are not Managed Accounts. Because Raymond James is discontinuing the Eagle Class – JPMorgan Money Market Funds as available sweep options, all references and content related to the Eagle Class – JPMorgan Money Market Funds have been deleted in their entirety.

The second to last sentence of the fourth paragraph of subsection "Raymond James Bank Deposition Program Disclosures" in the "Sweeps (Transfers) To and From Income-Producing Accounts" section is deleted and replaced with the following:

"Once funds equal to the Deposit Threshold have been deposited for you through the Progin each Bank on the Priority List, any additional cash balances will be directed to the Client Interest Program, which is eligible for coverage provided by the Securities Investor Protectic Corporation (SIPC) and excess SIPC, or, if you do not elect the above option, or if you are religible for CIP, to a designated bank (an "Excess Bank") without limit and without regard to maximum-available FDIC insurance coverage. Please refer to the section titled "Information About FDIC Insurance" for additional information."

Additionally, effective on or about May 5, 2019, Raymond James is changing the calculation methodology for determining interest rate tiers for your cash sweep deposits from a total assets (calculation non-cash) based analysis to a cash-based analysis. This methodology change is described more fully in the revised language in the "Sweeps (Transfers) To and From Income-Producing Accounts" disclosure section, as set forth below, which will take effect on the same date. We currently anticipate that this change in calculation methodology will not substantially impact most clients; however, as interest rates are heavily impacted by market conditions, we are unable to determine what the impact will be to your account(s). Some clients may receive an increase in the applicable interest rate, while other clients may receive a decrease in the applicable interest rate. Additional information will be provided at the end of April on Raymond James' public website at http://www.raymondjames.com/rates.htm or you may contact your financial advisor. Below and attached please find a CAMO update and report in anticipation of the regularly scheduled CSAC meeting scheduled for May 14, 2019 in Los Angeles, CA:

1. CAMO SAFETY AND SUSPENSION REPORT: UPDATE

There have been no major injuries of a heightened concern for the commission to review since the last CSAC meeting and report on February 19, 2019 in Anaheim, CA. All suspensions since the February 19, 2019 CSAC meeting have been attached hereto as Exhibit A. CAMO did see a precautionary transport on the Combate Americas event on April 26, 2019 in Los Angeles, CA involving an amateur fighter. The athlete was released from care shortly thereafter and is doing well. By all accounts, the evacuation process was effective and efficient.

2. FINANCIAL REPORT:

CAMO has provided Executive Officer Andy Foster with CAMO's most recent tax returns including an internal financial report in advance of the July 24, 2018 meeting. CAMO reserves are within required operating ranges.

3. PED & DRUGS OF ABUSE TESTING:

As announced at the December 11, 2018 CSAC meeting, CAMO is in the process of designing a new comprehensive drug testing program that includes testing for anabolic steroids for amateur athletes—the first of its kind. CAMO has tested at every event southern California event since the February 19, 2019 Commission meeting. CAMO is currently in the process of training inspectors and adjusting the process to make the program efficient and effective. We are currently focused on coordinating and training our northern California inspectors so that a uniform testing process and procedure may be created across the state.

4. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS; FEMALE ATHLETES:

On April 26, 2019, four female CAMO athletes were asked to compete on the Combate Americas fight promotion in Los Angeles, CA. Combate Americas is a widely recognized professional promotion and a significant amount of their roster includes CAMO alumni. Combate Americas featured two CAMO female MMA bouts in their current search for talent. CAMO proudly continues to produce the majority of the female talent in the industry, an interesting and compelling trend.

5. CAMO UPCOMING EVENTS:

As requested by the Commission, attached please find our upcoming event calendar (Exhibit B) that is also maintained on our website: www.camomma.org. CAMO is off to an exciting 2019. It is always our pleasure to have a member of the Commission visit our events.

In closing, we look forward to advancing our steroid testing program. We hope to continue to collaborate with CSAC in 2019 to explore opportunities to advance our unified interest in preventing the use of performance enhancing substances and to maintain CAMO at the forefront of this issue. 
