



# **Enforcement Performance Measures**


#### Q3 Report (January – March 2017)








#### PM4 | Formal Discipline – Volume

Cases closed after transmission to the Attorney General for formal disciplinary action. This includes formal discipline, and closures without formal discipline (e.g., withdrawals, dismissals, etc.).
