



## Order Extending May 6, 2020, Order Waiving Face-to-Face Supervision Requirements for Psychology Trainees

On March 4, 2020, the Governor proclaimed a <u>State of Emergency</u> to exist in California as a result of the impacts of COVID-19 to make additional resources available, formalize emergency actions already underway across multiple state agencies and departments, and help the state prepare to respond to an increasing number of individuals requiring medical care and hospitalization as a result of a broader spread of COVID-19.

Pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order N-39-20, during the State of Emergency, the Director of the California Department of Consumer Affairs may waive any statutory or regulatory professional licensing requirements pertaining to individuals licensed pursuant to Division 2 of the Business and Professions Code, including requirements related to the education, training, and experience necessary to obtain licensure.

On May 6, 2020, the Director issued an Order Waiving Face-to-Face Supervision Requirements for Psychology Trainees. The order was scheduled to expire on July 5, 2020, but on July 1, 2020, the Director extended the order to September 3, 2020. On August 27, 2020, the Director further extended the order to November 2, 2020. On October 22, 2020, the Director extended the order to December 31, 2020. And on December 15, 2020, the Director extended it to February 28, 2021.

The Director hereby further extends the Order Waiving Face-to-Face Supervision Requirements for Psychology Trainees. The order now terminates April 30, 2021, unless further extended.

This order is effective immediately but may be amended as circumstances require.
