



## Order Extending July 28, 2020, Order Waiving Restrictions On Chiropractic School Schedules And Class Lengths

On March 4, 2020, the Governor proclaimed a <u>State of Emergency</u> to exist in California as a result of the impacts of COVID-19 to make additional resources available, formalize emergency actions already underway across multiple state agencies and departments, and help the state prepare to respond to an increasing number of individuals requiring medical care and hospitalization as a result of a broader spread of COVID-19.

Pursuant to the Governor's Executive Order <u>N-39-20</u>, during the State of Emergency, the Director of the California Department of Consumer Affairs may waive any statutory or regulatory professional licensing requirements pertaining to individuals licensed pursuant to Division 2 of the Business and Professions Code, including requirements related to the education necessary to obtain licensure.

On July 28, 2020, the Director issued an Order Waiving Restrictions On Chiropractic School Schedules And Class Lengths. The order was scheduled to expire on September 26, 2020, but on September 17, 2020, the Director extended it to December 31, 2020. On December 15, 2020, the Director extended it again to June 30, 2021. And on July 1, 2021, the Director extended it to August 31, 2021.

The Director hereby further extends the Order Waiving Restrictions On Chiropractic School Schedules And Class Lengths to December 31, 2021.

This order is effective immediately but may be amended as circumstances require.
